Deering School House

Acquired through donation in 2007. This last untouched one room school in Waterboro was moved to the grounds of the Taylor/Frey/Leavitt House. A re-dedication of the restored school was held in 2011 with Deering family members participating.

Taylor/Frey/Leavitt House

This 1850 historic home was acquired through a 99 year lease with the Town in 2008. It was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2004. Open 9 AM to 12 PM on Saturdays, May 24 thru Sept. 27, 2014.

Acquired in April 2010 through a donation. Restoration continues thru the generous donations of businesses and volunteers. Placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2012.
