

The 1850 Taylor/Frey/Leavitt House Museum in Waterboro Center

Open to the public free of charge each Saturday from 9am to 12noon, May 28th – Sep 24th



The 1850 Taylor/Frey/Leavitt House Museum, 6 Old Alfred Road at the intersection with Sokokis Trail, Waterboro Center, is an unspoiled dwelling with many original features.

In 2004 it was placed on the National Register of Historic Places.

It will be open to the public free of charge, with donations appreciated, each Saturday morning, 9AM to Noon, from May 28th through September 24th.

The museum complex includes the period-furnished one-room 1817 Deering Schoolhouse. The barn and ell of the house contain antique cobbler, optician, and barber shops.




