This rescue could have been much more difficult had this been a deep water location in the lake. We are thankful that Tom and Dakota are safe and sound after this ordeal..



Our fire department is in need of a rescue sled such as the one shown to the left. This sled will not only rescue a stranded animal, but also humans in need of help either on the ice or in water. The sled is about \$4,000.00 dollars and I am willing to try and help do what I can to help make this happen for our community. I have set up a canister at **Lakeside Market** and would like to thank them for letting me put it there.
