Overview

A cold front will approach the region tonight and cross the area Saturday. Ahead of the front today, high temperatures and humidities will reach dangerous levels. Thunderstorms will be a threat from late this afternoon through Saturday across the region. If thunderstorms move repeatedly over the same area, there could be flash flooding.

Today

High Temperatures and high dew points will contribute to dangerous conditions. Heat advisories and excessive heat warnings are in effect for portions of the region.


There is a **possibility** of severe thunderstorms across portions of the region late this afternoon and evening.

Saturday

Thunderstorms are **likely** across the region with severe thunderstorms **possible**.

Temperatures should be a bit lower across the region due to clouds and precipitation.






Today's Severe Risk

Timing

Today

The greatest threat for thunderstorms and severe thunderstorms will be from late this afternoon through this evening with the greatest threat across the mountains of New Hampshire and Maine. If thunderstorms move repeatedly over the same area, there could be flash flooding. Thunderstorms are already occurring across the Western Maine mountains.

Tonight

Thunderstorms and the possibility of flash flooding will continue to be a threat overnight across the mountains of New Hampshire and western Maine.

Saturday

The threat of thunderstorms and severe thunderstorms will gradually spread from north to south across the region during the morning hours with the greatest threat during the afternoon. We will be monitoring the flash flood potential as storms develop.
