This is a follow up reminder that on Sunday June 3, 2012, the American Diabetes Association will host the Kennebunks Tour de Cure, our annual one-day cycling event that begins and ends at the Wells Reserve at Laudholm. The Kennebunks Tour de Cure passes through your town and we wanted to make you aware of our presence in the community. This event supports the American Diabetes Association mission: to prevent and cure diabetes and to improve the lives of all people affected by diabetes. Through research, information and advocacy the American Diabetes Association supports more than 100,000 Maine residents affected by diabetes.


The ride begins at 7:00 am and we expect the last rider to have completed the course by 3:00 pm. The five routes have a staggered start so although we expect 850 riders, they will not be leaving the Wells Reserve at Laudholm at the same time. At no time will more than 100 riders pass through your town as a group. I have enclosed our route maps, turn-by-turn directions can be found on our website at www.diabetes.org/kennebunkstourdecure. I've also enclosed a copy of the certificate of insurance for the Town of Waterboro for your records. Please share these documents with any departments affected.

All routes will be clearly marked in advance of the ride. So you are aware, a volunteer will be out marking the roads during the last weeks of May and first week in June. We will be put up signage on Saturday, June 2, 2012. All participants are required to wear helmets and follow the rules of the road. We will have volunteer support vehicles to help provide additional safety to our participants. As usual our staff and volunteers will make sure all areas are cleaned of all Tour de Cure materials when we leave.
