

WINTER REMINDERS

Snow: State of Maine Title 29A; 2396-4 PROHIBITS *placing snow or slush on a public way* and is punishable by a **\$165.00 fine**. Please do not plow, shovel, or snow blow snow into the road. Doing so forces Waterboro's road crew to go back where they have already plowed to clean up someone's mess which wastes time and money. Because of consistent complaints each winter, I have asked the Road Commissioner to report individuals leaving snow in the road so appropriate action can be taken. Leaving "snow trails" in the road after having pushed snow across it with a plow is no exception. Mailboxes: Because the contracts between the Town of Waterboro and its' snowplowing contractors require that roads be cleared of snow to the outside edges of the shoulders of the roads, it is vitally important that all plowed rights of way within the town remain clear of obstruction. It is therefore the obligation of all owners and occupants of property within the town to assure that **no mailboxes, paper boxes, signs or similar structures obstruct plowed rights of way**. Any such structures within a right of way exist there at the risk of the owner. Neither the Town nor the snowplow contractors are responsible for damage caused to the structure by the plow.
