

Waterboro Charter Review Commission

The Waterboro Charter Review Commission will hold a Public Hearing on Monday, November 7th. at 7 PM. The Hearing will be held in the Selectmen's Meeting Room at Town Hall.

The purpose of this hearing is to receive information, views and comments from the public. Topics for discussion will include, but are not limited to:

Road Commissioner: Should the position be elected or appointed? If appointed, should the title be changed to Public Works Director and have authority over both the roads and transfer station?

Budget approval: Should the town continue with the open Annual Town Meeting or vote on the budget by referendum (ballot) vote?

Town Administrator: Should the town continue with a Board of Selectmen/Town Administrator form of government? Should the Administrator be given more authority in the Charter with advice and consent of the Board of Selectmen? Should the town change to a Board of Selectmen/Town Manager form of government?

Board of Selectmen: Should the town continue with a five (5) member Board? Should the town change back to a three (3) member Board?
