Dear Mr. Abbott:

I received both copies of your letter to the Highway Commission and I took the matter up, and I find that you will have \$961.00 maintenance for third class roads this year; \$418.83 was left over from last year. This makes a sum of \$1,379.83.

If you gentlemen will agree to use this money for tar on the two miles of third class road that you would like to have the State take over, the State will put in the remaining six hundred twenty-five odd dollars and that whole road can be tarred. If you agree on this I think that it can be fixed so that you can use your third class road money on the State aid road after the (State aid money is expended) by designating that road as a third class road, then next year if you wish to expend your State aid money on this road, it can be redesignated.

It seems to me that this would be the best, and as far as I can see, the only way to get the two miles and fifteen hundreds of third class road tarred and taken over by the State.

Please let me hear from you on this at your earliest convenience, as I expect the tar crew is in Waterboro or near there at the present time.
