

MINUTES

Selectmen's Meeting, Jan. 25, 1978

HEARINGS:

7:30 p.m. Public Hearing held for General Revenue Sharing. Hearing opened by Chmn. Willett and explaining the reason for the hearing. Seven people present besides the three Selectmen. Adjourned, 7:40 p.m.

7:40 p.m. Public Hearing held for Antirecession Funds. Hearing opened by Chmn. Willett and explaining reason for the hearing, seven people present besides the Selectmen. Adjourned 7:50 p.m.

Student Labor: Hall, said that Betty Richards from SAD#57 had called and told him that there are students available to do meaningful work for the Town under a Federal funded program 16 hours a week. Selectmen decided to take no action on this request.

Chandler Holmes: Hall said Holmes would like a replacement of a street light by his house to a mercury vapor, Selectmen said they would review this and make a decision.

INSURANCE:

Workmen's Compensation: Selectmen questioned the increase of price. Dubois & Grondin said this was based on payroll. If the Selectmen could get from the contractors that plow, sand and etc., for the Town to show their certificate from Workmen's Comp. the rate would be decreased. Grondin said that the certificate should be stapled to the payroll ledger, for the Insurance auditor to see when he makes his yearly audit.

General Liability: The policy now covers the Town for \$300,000. on body or property damage from the public. The State sets the rate, this covers the Dump, Town House, Office Bldg. and athletic field.

Office Bldg. Policy: An all risk coverage was suggested by the Insurance men the cost increase being from \$118. to \$129. which would cover most any damage.

Town House Policy: Presently covered for fire only for \$10,000. for \$95. they suggested an all risk coverage for \$15,000. for \$83. through their company. The present coverage is through the Scribner Agency.

New Dam Road: Hall said that Mr. Simonds was in and talked to Rd. Comm. Robert Fay and that Simonds had no objections to the Town building a turn around on his property on the New Dam Rd. by Little Ossipee River and Ledgemere Bridge.

C.E.P. Director: Hall said Linda Lee from the C.E.P. Office had called and asked that a replacement be made for John Smith who had resigned from the post of C.D. Director for Waterboro in Oct. 1977.

CETA: Chmn. Willett asked Albert Hall about his job through CETA, Hall said he had called and been told by County Comm. Fred Ayer that if the Town had not made funds available for his position to be carried on after the dead line date of Sept. 30, 1978 that his position through CETA would be expiring as of Jan. 31, 1978. Willett said that since no monies had been provided for this position from the Town that the Selectmen would have to make the decision and that Mr. Hall's job would expire Jan. 31, 1978.

Selectmen joined a Finance Committee meeting, being held in another room.
