Meeting opened by Chmn. Monteith, thanked everyone for their support at Town Meeting. He also explained the article voted at Town Meeting to give the C.E.O./Bldg. Insp. to the Assessor, but that the Town would still use Allen Jordan's expertise in this area. Mr. Darling asked if Mark Caldwell would still be available to attend the ZBA hearings, Monteith and Willet said that he would and also be available to the Planning Bd at their meetings.. Monteith stated that several new appointments to various committees would be made soon, He also explained that the architect had been contacted about the addition to the Town House and would have spec's. available soon., that hearings and special meetings would be held on this . Also some concerned citizens would be called, that may have possibly missed the past meetings , although they had been posted around Town and published in the Journal Tribune. The local contractors will be contacted for their help and bids are to be accepted on the work. He also stated some one would be in charge, a so called "cleck of the works".

Willis Lord, Rd. Comm. gave a brief review of his work and conditions of the roads in Town.

Douglas Foglio, Planning Bd. Chmn., gave a lengthy discription of two subdivisions that are being reviewed by the Planning Board---Crabtree Acres and Buff Brook Estates. Also he pointed out something should be done

about discontinuance and abandonment of some of the old Town roads.

John Young, ZBA, Vice Chmn. asked about changing some of the stipulations in the Zoning Ordinance,

Allen Jordan said he had seventeen changes to present to the Planning Board at their next meeting. Willett said that a larger fee for applications for variance should be considered.
