Selectmen Willett opened the meeting. Willett explained the progress on the new addition to the Town House. The plans have been reviewed by local building contractors and sent ~~the plans~~ back to the architect to be revised. Hearings and public meeting will be held on this and hopefully bids to go out within six weeks.

Willett said that a meeting had been set up for April 28th. with several Town's on Solid Waste Disposal. Discussion was held on the possibility of going to an Incinerator ~~instead~~ in stead of Land Fill.

Willis Lord: Stated that he had been cutting wood along Town ways and had sold 4 cord of wood for the Town. He said he had staked the land for the Salt Shed and had hoped to meet with the Selectmen and Planning Board at the site for their views. Lord said he would have to order 6 - 50 MPH signs. Grading of roads would start Thursday. He announced that a meeting with the road contractors would be held April 19 in order that the work could be divided up equally. He also said with new people moving in the Middlebranch Pond area, and that the road would have to be plowed this Winter.

John Young: Stated that the Board of Appeals had received an appeal from Ireus Co. and that he would be calling Atty. Elliott for advise on the matter.

Douglas Foglio: The Planning Board had granted a Conditional Preliminary Plan ~~xxx~~ approval to Buff Brook Estates.

Richard Eugley: The Committee was working on purchase of a new Ambulance.

Willis Lord: Hoped that there would be at least ~~xx10%~~ less than a 10% increase in the SAD#57 budget . He also explained the line budget that the District has adopted, as he understood it at the present time.

Linwood Rollins: Stated that if the County Budget went through with the cut, he felt that it may save the Town of Waterboro at least \$10,000.

Willett, said that the Selectmen hoped to have a Spring Clean up and asked how every one felt about the project. It was discussed.

Richard Meggison was asked if he would be willing to take the job of Electrical Code Enforcement, if the Town enacted an Ordinance. He said he would give it some thought.
