Meeting opened by Jean Chick.

Willis Lord: Reported that the brush along Thyng's Mill's Rd, by Mike Hickey and Dave Michaud property was being cut by the two property owners at their expense and that Michaud was quite sure he could save the Town money by purchasing cast iron pipe to be used for culvert, therefore, the bulk of the appropriation could go toward the gravel. He also said that there would be TRI money forth coming, and if the referendum passed that the State would kick in about \$50,000. to go toward rebuilding the Ledgemere Bridge. Rollins asked Lord if he thought there would be an unexpended balance in the Thyng's Mill Account, Lord said, impossible on 6/10 of a mile that he would use the \$4,000. appropriation and go as far as he could, if they had to walk they walked. (Because of mud season, etc.)

Lord commented on the S.A.D. Budget election, all items passed, Article #2 on Administration passed by 7 votes. He went on to explain the voting list check, petition and the Atty. Gen. opinion that the Board be asked to request a recount. He reported that Waterboro's share of the budget would be over \$550,000. this year.

Eugley: Reported that papers had been signed on the purchase of a new Ambulance for \$29,870. and would be delivered in Mid-Aug. It is being considered that the Dept. sell the present Ambulance to the Goodwin's Mills Dept. which will be decided at a Special meeting Tuesday p.m. Rollins asked if it would mean a decrease in the appropriation. Eugley said no, that the money would be used toward the purchase of new High Band radio equipment for the Dept.

Chauncey Gerry: Stated that the subject of spreading raw sewerage on the Hamilton property on the Hamilton Rd. was discussed, after a complaint at the last Conservation Comm. meeting. Discussion was held on processed sludge for reuse as fertilizer. Also discussed was the health hazards spreading raw sewerage.

Chauncey Gerry: As Constable he said that he had received complaints on the Ossipee Lake parking problems along Rte. 5, where the Town has an "No Parking" Ordinance. Also up by Dr. Davis property in No. Waterboro by the Ossipee Dam. Constables Gerry and Waterhouse were given tickets to be issued to violators.

Linwood Rollins: Asked if Selectman Fay could give him the status on the Youth League Ball field. He said that many townspeople such as himself would like to see this project finished. Fay said he did not like to be put on the spot and that he was acting under the direction of the Chairman of the Youth and Recreation Council, trying to get things done, field mowed, cement forms poured for the building to be placed on, water supply in, etc. Rollins said he did not mean to be putting Fay on the spot, but felt that he was the only one present that might have the answers. Rollins asked if what he had heard was true, that there was dissension among the Council members over the actions and etc. involving the Ballfield. Fay said if there was he was not aware of it. Mrs. Holden said her husband is a member of the Council and that he felt there is a lack of communications within the Council. Meetings are called with only 24 hour notice and cancel without notice given, etc. On one occasion a meeting was held with only three members present and various decisions were made without a quorum present, which the by-laws of the Council states a Min. of 5 members are to be present to represent a quorum.

Rollins asked if Larry Moody, Andrew Woodsome, Jr and Douglas Foglio were members of this Committee. Fay said they were not. Selectman Willett said that as far as the Seletmen were concerned that the three above mentioned men were not interested in the ballfield, since they had been contacted several times in the past to attend meetings of the Council and had not done so. Willett asked that a notice be sent to all members of the Council notifying them that a meeting would be held Tuesday, June 26th at 8:30 p.m.

Willett: Reported as Willis Lord had on the TRI money and Ledgemere Bridge. He announced that a Solid Waste meeting would be held June 21st at the Alfred Town Hall at 7:30 p. m.

Willett said the Town House Addition project was about ready to go to bid. He also said that having the local contractors attend several meetings and give their ideas had saved the Town money.

Clinton Presby: In to discuss his property located on Red School House Rd, Ross Corner. He feels that the Town Rd. is going through his property and wants it relocated to where he feels it was originally. Willett said that several old time residents had told him that the road was always located where it is at the present time and that the Selectmen in this case could not help him. Mr. Presby said he would pursue the matter further.

Central Maine Power to be called to request a street light be installed at the corner of Deerings Ridge Rd. on the West Buxton Rd end.

9:15 p.m.

Tatusko & Shurfelt: Present to request a Victualers License, for The Store. Willett informed them that this has to be posted for 7 days in 2 places before it can be acted on. They requested then that a hearing be held Tuesday, June 26th. Willett informed them that he could not be present at the hearing. Discussion was held on the reasons why the license was not issued June 12th. Willett said he thought this was explained to Tatusko by Chmn. Monteith on the phone June 12th., that it was denied because of complaints received about the former establishment. Shufelt said he felt that Willett was using stalling tactics, so that they could not open The Store to get the Summer business. He also stated that since he had been involved with the business they had not received any complaints and there had not been any excessive noise. Willett said that complaints were voiced at the hearing held May 27th. Selectman Fay also stated that Mr. Abbott did complain at the hearing about recent disturbance and noise coming from the establishment. Tatusko said they needed a Victualers license in order to get a SBA loan and that they planned to use the entire building as a restaurant. Hearing to be held on June 26th. 7:30 p.m. for Victualers license.
