Selectmen's Meeting

Present: Chmn. John Monteith, Daniel Willett, Robert Fay, Dianne Holden, Jean Chick.

Chauncey Gerry: In to discuss parking tickets , asked if he could block out "call the Town Clerk's Office within 24 hours", as he would be issuing them on a weekend and the Town office is closed Monday's. He was told he could do so. Traffic and parking along Rte.5 discussed.

Victularx License: Opened by Chmn, Monteith, reading of the notice for "Roge's Restaurant". Willett approved, seconded by Monteith. License issued.

C.E.Gile: In concerning property owned by him and his son adjacent to Town property on Rte.202. Selectmen told him they would write him a letter stating that the Town agreed with his surveyor that the Town owned one acre parcel.

Mrs. Holden: Several minor matters discussed with Selectmen and tax liens on Shirley Morrison property on Lake Sherburne. She would like to pay all back taxes and liens fees due and have a quit claim deed signed by the Selectmen. Willett said he would call the Town Atty. to discuss this and the Selectmen would make their decision later.

Babe Morrill: Acting Fire Chief, in to discuss Insurance for the Dept. former Insurance had lapsed as of June, Morrill said he had signed papers with Garnsey Bros. Agency. He said that the Dept had sold the old Ambulance to the Goodwins Mills Fire Det. for \$2,500. without the radios, which will be place in the new Ambulance when it arrives. Monteith asked Morrill to call State Fire Inspector, Dolby to check out the Sawmill Restaurant for hazards.

Willettt asked if a Town Ordinance for installing wood stoves would be of any help to the Dept. Morrill said he would discuss it at the next meeting at which time the Dept would be electing new officers,
