Chmn. Monteith opened the meeting, he spoke on the budget, said that there should be no overdrafts. He also spoke on the Dump and meetings that the surrounding Town's are having, the next meeting to be held in Dayton Town Hall Thursday, July 19th at 7:30 pm. He said that it would cost between 75, to 100,000. to run a Dump. Monteith said he hoped that the taxes would be run the first of Aug. and that the increase would be approx. 4 mil.

Monteith said the Youth & Recreation Comm. were having a meeting with contractors to place bids for the work needed to be done to finish the ball field project. Selectmen Fay said that Frank Carroll from Limerick had donated the foundation for the small building on the field.

Chmn. Monteith stated that the bids for the Town House Addition would be opened on July 31.

Monteith said that two areas in Town had been asked to clean up their property and had not done so and that the State Police had been called in and the matter would be taken care of by the Dept.

Willis Lord: Noted that \$4,439.04 would be coming to the Town from TRI. He said he had reviewed the roads in Brookside and feels that all recommendations of the Road Review Comm. had been carried out. In Northwood Village roads were not satisfactory to him because of the surfacing and not any ditches. Lord said he felt that the Town was not allocating enough funds for seal coat. He discussed the Michael Hickey road and that C.M.P. were to relocate several poles in Town for him.

Monteith: mentioned that the roads in Westwinds Dev. had not been accepted by the Town, therefore, they were not going to be maintained by the Town such as plowed, etc. He said things looked good as far as Ledgemere Bridge being repaired with help from the State.

Chauncey Gerry: He stated that he had several complains, most of them on salespersons in the area selling books.

Connie Marshall: Announced that the Conservation Comm would be placing a float in the Firemen's Field Day and also manning a booth.

Mrs. Marshall said she and Mrs. Leighton had attended Solid Waste Field Trips and reported at the Solid Waste area meetings.

Willis Lord: Explained the vote inspection requested of the Town Clerk's by the S.A.D. #57 Director's on the voting June 7th.

Babe Morrill: Stated that he was just filling in as Fire Chief until the next meeting when elections would be held. He also reported on the purchase of the new ambulance and the sale of the present ambulance to Goodwin's Mill Fire Dept.

Mark Caldwell: Willis Lord asked how he was coming on the Town Assessment. Mark stated that it was just about completed.
