Tom Cole:In to discuss the Town Owned lots being placed in the Realtors hands per Town Meeting. Monteith told him the decision would be made tonight.

Mr. & Mrs. Robert Carroll: Mr. Carroll represented the Saco River Telephone Company requesting a letter of approval from the Town allowing the Company to run Cable T.V. throughout the Town on the Companies poles. Carroll said a telephone survey had been done and 40% were in favor of the Cable T.V. for the Town. The letter surplyed by the Town will be sent to Washington and the Company is hopefull that it will receive a franchise from the F.C.C..

Mr. Carroll was asked at this time to have a pay phone installed in the Town Hall for use by the citizens renting the Hall.


Road Commissioner: Glenn Bean, in with payroll. Selectman Monteith asked that the signs by the Old Elementary school in So. Waterbor be removed as the State has requested. Atkinson Electric will be hired to remove the blinking light on Rte 202 by the school.

James Hamilton: Mr. Hamilton returned to discuss the assessment on his Hamilton Rd. property. He outlined, for Mr. Woodsome's benefit (Mr. Woodsome being new on the Board ) his proposal he had presented to the Board at an earlier date, the fact that he may place his property in Tree Growth, for a lessor value or if the Board would agree to cut the assessment on his home by 10%, he would not place his road frontage, as planned under Tree Growth, The Selectmen said they thought the State would change the Tree Growth Law. They did agree to reduce the assessment on Hamilton's Garage, Mr. Hamilton said he wouldn't put land into Tree Growth.
