COUNCIL MEETING

Meeting opened by Selectman Monteith.

Picnic Area Rte.5: Monteith commented on the meeting held at the Town Hall, June 10, 1981 concerning the Town receiving the Boat Ramp along with the Picnic Area. Monteith said the Town would receive a grant of \$1,685. toward the purchase price of \$2,880. if it accepted the Boat Ramp. Reps. from the Bureau of Parks and Recreation said that the Town would be exempt from liability of injuries under the "Maine Tort Claims Law". M.M.A. will be called to get their advise on the exemption. Discussion held on charging fees for admission to the area.

Webber Property Monteith noted that final paperwork had not been done on the purchase of the Webber property. Selectmen waiting for Willis Webber to have the parcel surveyed. A retainer has been sent to Webber as a binder for the purchase.

Lake Arrowhead Lots: Special Town Meeting to be held July 7th. at 8:00 P.M. To give the Selectmen the authority to sell Town owned lots, discussion.

Old Office Bldg. on Lakewood Dr.: Sold, new owners have moved in.

Cable T.V. Saco River Tel. & Tel. Co. have made application through the Federal Government for the franchise. Discussion.

Caterpillars: Selectmen wished to make clear that the Town did not refuse money for spraying for the Gypsy Moth as rumored around town. A committee will be formed in town and possibly present an article at Annual Town Meeting to raise monies to spray in 1982.

Planning Board: Roland Denby said the he had attended a meeting at the Town Hall June 9, 1981 on the problems of disposal of septic tank waste, he said he was disturbed by the fact that tanks are being installed now are to large to function properly for the fact that they do not keep active enough for the bacteris to work well. Discussion.

Denby said Zoning Ordinance revision will require more changes still before hearings are held.

Chmn. Frank Goodwin said the Board was also setting up road standards and questioned if the Town actually owned any roads or if the land owner abutting the roads owned it. Discussion.

Rd. Commissioner: Glenn Bean said that he had been cold patching getting ready to Seal Coat.

Charter Comm.: Hammond said the Commission, through resignations from Stephanie Hutchinson and James Carll had two new members Thomas C ole and Paul Willihnganz. He said that the Commission had been interviewing Town Officials and employees to get their opinion on changes to be made in Town Government.

Parks & Recreation: Chmn. Sevigny said the committe had plans, if the Town Officers would go along with it, on having the National Guards come in and build a skating rink and a soccer field, on the Town's property on the Old Alfred Rd., next to the Little League Ballfield.

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

Gun Permit: A vote was taken on issuance of a concealed weapons permit for Stanley Ricker. Monteith, no; Andrew Woodsome, Jr. no; Robert Fay, yes. A letter will be sent to Mr. Ricker to notify him that his application was denied.

Howard Stone: Voted by the Selectmen that the Treasurer start deducting taxes from the Dump Attendants pay.

Committee: Judy Michaud, made Chairman of a committee being formed to control saterpillars in the Town of Waterboro. Mrs. Michaud will circulate a petition throughout the town to have an article placed on the Warrant for Annual Town Meeting to raise monies for the spraying to fight Gypsy Moths.
