## MINUTES

Dec. 8, 1981

Present: Chmn. Robert Fay, John Montieth, Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Jean Chick, Debra Hardy

Arthur Clark, State Highway Dept: Mr. Clark will pass the Town's Parking Ordinance before the Commission so that the State will back up the Selectmen on the problems of parking along Rte. 202 & 4 in So. Waterboro. Problem areas being the Square, in front of the Milk Room and the Waterboro Superette and Hardware. Clarke said he had observed the Superette area Nov. 19th., and he feels that only parallel parking should be allowed, before a bad accident is caused by backing out into the Highway. He also done a speed check and vehecles are passing by the area to fast. He feels that there would be enough parking on both sides of Rte 202, for the business if Ordinance declâres only parallel parking. This is the Sêlectmen's decision, but the State will back them up if ever they were to go to court on this matter.

A speed check has been done on the Rte. 5 area in E. Waterboro and the speed limit will be dropped lower. The Selectmen requested that a speed check be done in front of the Hunnewll Camping Area in the summer.

John Martel: Asked that one half mile of his road be plowed, on Ossipee Lake. He was told that an Article would have to be presented at Annual Town Meeting for this, but he could contact the Town Contractor, Mr. Abbott and hire him to plow for him.

Leon Bien, V. Pres., Money Center of the Canal Nat'l. Bank of Portland: met with the Selectmen and Dianne Holden, with Daniel Willett setting in, to discuss the 1982 Tax Anticipation Loan for the Town. Selectmen agreed to go with Canal again this year, as they were very satisfied with the 1981 arrangement of borrowing and investing. It was voted to go for \$600,000. this year because of the possible raise in the school payments and also the closing of the present Town Dump. A cash form will be sent to the Town.

The certificates and documents will be sent to the Town by Atty. F. Paul Frinsko, it was voted to sign them.

Mr. Ed Soule: in to ask the Selectmen to have the Old Clark's Bridge Rd plowed at the foot of Hasty Hill into her house. It hasn't been plowed the last few years as no one had been living in there. Contractor Abbott to be notified and asked to plow and let the Selectmen know the price.

R.L.Stevens : In to let the Selectmen know that he will be opening the Transfer Station Wednesday, Dec.16th., using the present dump as a Stump Dump until the new one is ready. The dump hours will be as in the past. He asked about lights at the Station and it was agreed by all to have C.M.P.Co. install 4 poles for \$2,300. and take the light from the old dump and move it to the new Station/ A person to be hired to direct citizens to the new dump for a week or two, to be stationed in front of old dump.

Monitoring Wells:Bids:

One bid submitted, Yankee Drilling 1,500. for each well total \$3,000. Voted and passed to accept the bid with one stipulation that the machine be set in and operating within one week after signing a Contract with the Town. Mr.Champney,owner will be sent a letter asking him to come to the Dec.15th. meeting for signing of the Contract.

Snow Plowing Bids:

Robert Abbott submitted the only bid, \$600.00 for plowing from the Old Dump to the New Dump into the Stump Dump , plus the McLucas road to Gordon Littlefield's,per year.

Mr. Abbott only bidder for the section of State Highway from Clint's Marine to Waterboro Center on Rte.5, \$1,400.00, per year, tabled for further consideration.

Chmn. Fay discussed the matter of Rd.Comm. Bean's truck damaging a garage on West Shore Rd. owned by Mildred Williams. It was decided that the Selectmen should notify Mrs. Williams that this would have to be taken up with Mr. Bean, by her as it was not Town equipment that caused the damage. A copy of a letter to Mr. Bean asking him to check in to this matter to be sent to Mrs. William's.
