MINUTES

March 23, 1982

Present: Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Robert Fay, Glenn Bean, Sr., Jean Chick, Dianne Holden.

Selectman Fay asked Rd. Comm. Bean to see that the Red School House Road and the Mountain Rd. were closed due to mud.

Dianne Holden demonstrated two copier machines from American Business Systems. The Selectmen voted to purchase the Sharp #750 for \$2,595. with a \$100. discount and the trade in of the old A.B. Dick copier for \$300. worth of supplies.

Selectmen voted to accept the bid of \$1,378.98 for carpeting for the upstairs offices from Main Street Sales, Limerick. Color to be picked out by Dianne & Jean.

Plumbing Inspector Van Foglio was given the go-ahead to start the plumbing upstairs.

James Sewall Co. to be called and requested that they forward the Town of Waterboro Map Linens to the Town. Mapping to be done by Rodney Chadbourne of Alfred.

M.M.A. to be called to inquire on the price of an insurance coverage for Town Constables.

Joint Meeting with the Selectmen, Parks & Rec. Comm, Conservation Comm. to be held April 1. to discuss the Picnic Area on Rte.5.

Letter to go out to James Foss to inform him of the vote at Annual Town Meeting to convey Map 15 Lot 9 to him upon payment of taxes, fees interest and cost of drafting the deed.

Selectman Fay reported on his meeting March 16th. with a Donald Kale from D.E.P. concerning the reclaiming of the Old Town Dump Fay said the main concern of D.E.P. is that the water table is high and that there be a tight covering of clay to prevent drainage and that all the surface used for dumping be covered. Fay also said that he had talked with Frank Goodwin and that Frank had agreed to work with D.E.P. for the Town on the reclaiming.

Letter was received concerning the claims that C.M. Thornton has on "Unknown" lots in Town from Atty. Elliott. Discussion held on the taxes for the DeLong property in So. Waterboro, back taxes are due in the amount of \$830.51. The property has been sold by auction by SBA. The new owners attorney called the office and talked with Selectman Woodsome and the attorney's opinion is that since the Town did not come forth at the bankruptcy hearing the Town is able to persue the collection of the back taxes.

Town Attorney Elliott is to be called for his opinion.

John Monteith voted in as Chairman of the Board of Selectmen.
