

MINUTES

May 4, 1982

Present: Chmn. John Monteith, Andrew Woodsome, Jr. & Robert Fay, Jean Chick.

Unit Ranger Andrew Mendes from the Maine Forest Service in Cornish in with an Inspection Report on the Town Stump Dump. On Discrepancies he had reported "Dump does not meet the 100ft. hazard clearance as required by MFS Statues T 12 Chap. 807. Corrective action required "100 ft. hazard clearance must be reestablished". In order to conform Ranger Menes said he would go to the dump and flag an area and Selectmen said they would have a dozer at the dump Thursday to scrape a 100 ft. perimeter, down to the gravel. The Ranger said that if the Town is in violation of this law that if a fire at the Dump got away from the firemen, the Town would not receive the reimbursement from the State. However, the Town does not pay their firemen and would not be eligible for reimbursement.

Montieth said that Walt Stinson would be meeting with the Selectmen next Tuesday night and have a proposal ready to go out to bid to reclaim the Old Town Dump.

Fire Chief Ray Emmons, Jr. And his Assist. John Smith in to discuss the Town Dump in general. Burning and the dumping habits of individuals using the area and the Stump Dump attendant.

The Selectmen announced that the Waterboro Patent Corp. had inquired about dumping the entire buildings that are being torn down at their plant in So. Waterboro being dumped at the Town Stump Dump. Presently the Town is using the Old Town Dump as a Stump Dump until the new Stump Dump is ready. The Chief quoted the price of \$75.00 per hour for the Fire Truck plus 3 men totaling \$100.00 per hour. Selectmen Woodosme added that a figure of \$6.00 per hour for the Town's dump attendant. Also an attendant may have to be on duty for 24 hours because of burning hazards.

The Chief said the Department will burn the Stump Dump every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday night.

Ranger Menes said that a 100 ft perimeter must be kept at all times around the new stump dump to comply with the MFS Statues. If the Town is interested in getting trees they should call Management Floyd Farrington in Alfred.

Rd. Comm. Bean was called and asked to come into the meeting. When he arrived he was informed by the Selectmen that the dump had to meet the Forest Statues and that Memnes would be at the dump Wednesday afternoon and was asked to meet with him and go over the area, also to have a dozer at the dump Thursday to scrape out a 100 ft perimeter around the dump.

Bean said he could get the well driller in to drill the monitoring wells anytime. Bruce Champney was called and at the present time has both of his drillers set up at sites and it would be at least two weeks before he could get to the site.

Selectmen Fay asked Bean about painting the crosswalk down in front of the Post Office and Bank and Bean said to hire someone else. It was decided to have Constable Waterhouse in his uniform and David Stevens do the job. Waterhouse to direct the traffic on Rte 202 and Stevens to paint the lines. Edna Rollins has the paint in which the Town will reimburse her for.

Bean said he asked Scott Paving and the price to do the Dump Rd. would be \$6,000. to spray 210 yards of topping, \$10.00 a yad. Also would need gravel. Monteith asked that he get the sides of the road cleaned up as he was asked to do last week.

Several Abstracts were worked on and some of the persons will be called and asked where the property is located.


