Sept. 14, 1982

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

Present: Chmn. John Monteith, Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Robert Fay,
Jean Chick, Glenn Bean

Concealed weapon permit issued to Henry Knight.

John Smith, representing the Fire Dept. in to inform the Selectmen that the Dept. had a large tank truck to be placed at the dumpster for fire protection. He also asked if the Board had any ideas where another tank could be placed as they have two available. Sel. Woodsome said he felt that if the tank truck was in place at the dump it would be in the way of additional work that will take place, if the Town is able to purchase more land to expand the Stump Dump. The Selectmen will let the Fire Dept. know when the site is ready for the tanker to be placed permanently at the dumpster.

Eudore Dube: In regarding the snow plowing of so called "Eon Way", a private road leading to Ossipee Lake off Rte. 5. Dube explained, that up until five years ago the road was being plowed. The fence and cement pad that the snow plowing Contractor had complained about has been there for years, according to Dube. Dube said that he would be willing to sign papers stating that the Town would not be responsible for damages to any Personal or real estate property, belonging to him and that he felt that Richard Cote, the owner of the fence would do the same, as long as they could be plowed out.

BMX: Race license signed for 9/18/82. No fee.

Selectman Woodsome reported that he had been quoted estimates for tarring section of entry by dumpster to cement building for \$1,000. An estimate of Ossipee Hill Rd. new construction site for between 7 and 8 thousand dollars.

David Silva: In to inform the Selectmen that his father David Silva, Sr. was happy and pleased with the job the Contractor done on his driveway off the Ossipee Hill Rd. and also that the Contractor had fixed the stone wall to his father's satisfaction.

Mr. Silva also asked, on behalf of his daughter, if the Board would like to purchase an ad in the Senior class book. Selectmen said they would discuss it later.

Personal Tax: Delinquent Personal Taxes for 1980 will be processed through Court on Sept. 27, according to Tax Collector Holden. Mrs. Holden asked if any of the Selectmen were planning to go, Monteith said no, that they felt that she could handle the matter.

Parks & Recreation Comm: Drawing on the Bike raffle. Chmn. Monteith drew Alan Dyer's name. Mrs. Holden to notify him.

Walt Stinson: Mr. Stinson will be called and asked to have D.E.P. representative Nancy Norman write the Town a letter of approval on the reclaiming of the landfill.

Rd. Comm Bean and Robert Abbott, Contractor:

Mr. Abbott was asked to attend the meeting to discuss the Snow Removal Contract for the Northern Section of Town.

Selectmen discussed the plowing of the "Eon Way" and Abbott said he would check the area out. The reason he stopped plowing was because of the fence being in the way for a turnaround.

Selectmen asked Abbott how much it would be for the additional 1,500 feet for the new dump compactor site. Abbott to get back to them on this.

Selectman Fay asked repeatedly what method of starting the plows would be used this year. Would Bean call Abbott as he did last year or would Abbott go out when two inches of snow had fallen. Both Abbott and Bean said it did not make any difference to them, what method was used that they would work something out.

Chmn. Monteith asked if any more additions needed to be made to the Contract. No reply was made.

Abbott said S,A.D. had called him on the phone assumingly about the plowing of the East Waterboro School yards. But that he had not returned their call. Monteith said that the Town would stay out of that situation.

Selectman Woodsome made note that the Old Office Building on Old Alfred Rd. should be deleted from the Contract.

Turn Arounds:

Abbott said that West Shore Rd. problems were a school bus parked in the old turnaround by William's and that he is now having to turn at Dana Blackburns. But that the entire road is private property and by Blackburn's it is up grade and a tree in the way.

Turnaround by Stubby Ham's needs more gravel and cutting out.

Turnaround by Brick House the ground not solid. Rd. Comm. Bean to check all three turnarounds out.

Woodsome asked how many trucks would be in use this year and Abbott replied Three. Woodsome said two trucks were used last year and many citizens lost days of work because the roads were not plowed. Abbott said that was just an excuse.

Glenn Bean: Woodsome said that Deerings Ridge road need cold patch along the sides of the road from Rte 202 up to the top of the hill. Also bad pot holes in the center of the road. He said Bean should check work when it is done, that the road is in very bad condition. Bean said he was not sure how many more days would be spent on tar patch.

Woodsome asked Bean if flowage area was done on the New Dam Rd. Bean said that crushed gravel in but not tarred, the culvert was plugged, but should be alright now, Woodsome said if not tarred around the area that work done would be lost, about 3 feet of the shoulder lost already.

Mowing: Started everything done in South Waterboro.

Flowage: Needs patch

Middle Rd: Not ditched on South end.
