

MINUTES

Selectmen's Meeting Sept. 28, 1982

Present: Chmn. John Monteith, Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Robert Fay, Jean Chick, Glenn Bean.

Mr. Nollette of Nolette & Payeur Construction Co. in to ask the Selectmen if he needed a permit for the trailer on one of his lots in Brookside Ests. He noted that it is a construction trailer and is licensed and is also for sale. He was directed to the Building Insp. office.

Mr. & Mrs Wishart in to ask that the road in by thier cottage be gravelled. Also the road hasn't any name and the Wisharts would like to name it "Wish Lane". The Board agreed that since the road is private property the Selectmen had no say over the sign being placed on the road way. Mr. Wishart also mentioned that the snow plow came over on to his property 2 feet. Also that the brush along the sides needed cutting. Selectmen suggested that he talk with the property owner Donald Johnson for his permission to cut along the road way.

Mr. Wishart stated that the Planning Board had allowed Kenneth Nado, a variance without notifying abutters, as the Ordinance states. The Selectmen informed Wishart that notices were sent out only when the appeal goes before the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Glenn Bean: Turnarounds discussed. Selectman Fay said he would meet Bean and go with him to check out the several turnarounds.

Selectman Fay said he had been asked by Ed Waterhouse to mention to the Selectmen that Waterhouse had some sand in his pit for winter sanding if the Selectmen were interested. Bean asked what the matter was with his sand pit and Fay said "nothing" just that Waterhouse had asked him to bring the matter up.

The Town sanders were discussed and Bean said none of them worked in reverse, only the newest one in good shape, some need parts. Selectmen said that Bean should have them all fixed as winter would be here and they would not be useable. Bean said that he also needed some new chains. Woodsome asked how many sanders the Town had. Bean said that Woodsome had 2, Bean has 2 and that part of one is stored in the Salt Shed.

Bean said that he had 2 cord of wood for the General Assistance cases.

Peter J. Hanson in to talk with the Selectmen for payment of the Reclaiming of the Landfill at the Old Town Dump. Selectmen were upset that Hanson had not used the stock pile of loam at the Stump Dump. Hanson said that the loam had 10 inch rocks. Monteith said that the loam was good, rocks only on the top part of the pile. And that Hanson should have brought the fact that he was not using the loam to the Selectmen's attention. The Selectmen said that they felt he should pay the Town for the loam. Hanson said he did not want to pay for something he did not use.


Hanson said he never promised the Selectmen that he would buy the loam. Selectmen said the intent was there when they had talked to him and that he had told them he would pay the Town for materials belonging to the Town that he used. Selectmen said they felt he was planning to use the loam until the very end and saw the grass growing. After a very lengthy discussion Hanson agreed to give the Town a \$1,446.00 credit off the bill for the loam. and that the loam would stay where it is.

Hanson was given a check for \$30,500. The Town holding back \$2,734.

Several abatements signed.
