

## MINUTES

Oct.12,1982

Selectmen's Meeting

Present: Chmn. John Monteith, Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Robert Fay,

William Adams: Property owner from Black Cove, off the East Shore Road in to ask the Selectmen if his road will be plowed this year. The Northern Section Snow Plowing Contract map was reviewed. The road in question is depicted on the map, to be plowed. Adams said that last year his road was plowed the day after the storms and at that only plowed a narrow path. Selectmen to speak to Bob Abbott on this matter.

Mr. & Mrs. Guy Dixon, property owners of Map 17, Lot 17, in to complain about a supplementary bill they received on a building on their property, that they had not been billed on for 1980 and 1981 and objected to the 13,020 value placed on it. Dixon also said that the 1 and should be assessed as Tree Growth for 20 years. Selectmen informed the Dixon's that paper work had to be filed in their office to obtain tree growth status. Forms on the Tree Growth Tax Laws were given to the Dixon's.

Ballot Clerks: Selectmen were asked if the Ballot Clerks would receive their supper as in the last few years paid for by the Town. Discussion on pay and price of the meals. Woodsome made the motion that the Ballot Clerks furnish thier own meals and Fay seconded. No comments were made by Chmn. Monteith, The Clerks will be notified of this decision by mail.

Road Hearings: Hearings to discontinue several roads will be held on Nov.9,1982, starting at 7:45P.M.

Peter Upton: It was brought to the Selectmen's attention that Mr. Upton's denied abatement had been questioned. Mr. Upon plans to go to the York County Commissioners for a hearing. He had informed the Selectmens office that the square footage was incorrect on the building, that appears on his assessment card. Selectmen decided to go with the denial.

Roger Hazel: Mr. Hazel had inquired about the assessed value of Lot 1322 that he had purchased from the Town. Mr. Hazel will be sent a letter explaining that the payment of 75% of the 1980 assessment was made to sell the lots and place them back on the tax rolls. The assessment to remain as it is.

Girls Scouts: Request made to sell food at Annual Town Meeting 1983. Selectmen to give the Youth League the first refusal on this as they have sold food for the past few years. Also the Scouts would like to provide a baby-sitting service at Town Meeting. Selectmen said they would go along with it as long as the Scouts paid for the use of the room or rooms involved, to the School District.

Tax Collector: Holden noted that \$250.00 had been received from the Town of Lyman in payment of 1981,82 plowing and sanding of the Deering Ridge Road.

\$20,009.00 received from Federal Revenue Sharing.

Glenn Bean: Stock Pile, Bean said he had the place, sand and screen. It would take 6 days work. Sand \$7,434. and \$4,000. for salt. Approx. \$12,000. for the stock pile. Salt prices discussed, Shurtleff Co. selling for \$32.00. Bean given the go ahead to start on Monday on the stockpile. He was told to hold off on the last list of work given him and start on the stockpile.



Bean said the turnaround by Stubby Ham's needed to be widened. Fay asked that he check the culvert needed on Bedard's road and that if a new one was needed that Bedard would pay for it.

The two Town chain saws are at Bean's. In case they are needed by General Assistance cases willing to cut their own fire wood on Town property.

Fay asked Bean once again to please take care of the tree in Ossipee Lake.
