

MINUTES

Selectmen's Meeting

Oct. 26, 1982

Present: Chmn. John Monteith, Andrew Woodsome, Robert Fay, Jean Chick, Debbi Hardy, reporter for the Journal Tribune.

Brian Clemmons, researcher from the Registry of Deeds did not show up for his 8:00 P.M. appointment. Selectmen voted to hire Mr. Clemmons to research the "Unknown Lots" for the Town. Selectman Fay to get in touch with Clemmons.

Gun Permit issued to Constable Ed Waterhouse. No fee required.

License issued for a BMX racing event to Waterboro Scrambles, Inc. No fee required.

Robert Carroll, Saco River Communications (Cable T.V.) in to ask the Selectmen to sign an Amendment to the original Franchise Agreement between the Corporation and the Town of Waterboro allowing the Corp. to place Cable T.V. system in the Town of Limington. Mr. Carroll displayed maps of the project and discussion was held on the customers receiving the service in Buxton, approx. 500 and the Town of Hollis approx. 100 to date. At this point the Corp. has expended \$700,000. It will cost approx. 150,000. for materials in the Town of Waterboro. Mr. Carroll said that if the Corp. could at this time go into Coventry North Subdivision and pick up at least 50 costumers while the contractor's the Corp. have hired it would be a savings to the Corp. rather than come back at a later date. Selectman Woodsome maintained that he would not sign the papers to allow this until cable had been laid in the Town of Waterboro. Carroll said that he did not feel that the work they planned to do in Limington would hurt the Town of Waterboro because they had to wait paper work from the F.C.C. before starting work unless they were granted an emergency application. Carroll said he felt they had at least eight working days in Buxton before they hit Beaver Ridge and Brookside Est.

Treas/TC Dianne Holden had asked the Selectmen about collecting interest on a late tax for Waterboro Industrial Bldg. a mistake was made and the tax monies were not received until an interest of approx. \$113.00 had incurred. Two votes for collecting the interest one against.

Mr. Zion, Waterboro Patent Corp. will be called and asked about the deed he took back with him for signing allowing the Town to purchase more land off the Bennett Hill Rd. to enlarge the Stump Dump area.

Selectmen discussed the possiblility of hiring another municipal lawyer to represent the Town in the Buff Brook subdivision road disagreement.

Chmn. Monteith opened the meeting by reading the letter sent to the Clerk's.


Dan Willett, Dem. Chm. of the Town Dem. Caucus said that he and John Monteith had started the free meal to the Clerks about five years ago. Selectman Woodsome said that he questioned the bill received in the Office from Roge's Restaurant after Annual Town Meeting. A discussion of the pay roll and cost of the meals was held. Willis Lord, Chmn. of the Rep. caucus said that he felt the Clerks should receive a raise making their pay \$4.00 per hour and time and a half after eight hours. Willett said he felt they should be getting \$4.00 also. Selectman Woodsome suggested that they develop six hour shifts, that way the Clerks would not get tired and confused at the end of the day, when it came time for counting. Clerk Gould asked that there not be so much confusion, by not allowing every one to come in around the counters talking, eating, etc., Clerk Denby said he felt that there would be less chance of error if the same Clerks worked the entire shift. Selectman Fay made the motion that the Clerks get \$4.00 per hour and time and a half after eight hours. Selectman Woodsome seconded. The vote was unanimous. Ballot Clerk Gould asked if the Clerks could have coffee either free or for a charge of ten cents. Selectman Woodsome said he would provide the pound of coffee for the Nov. election day.

Finance Comm. Chmn. Willett asked that notices be sent out to all Social Service Agencies and all Town Committees asking that they file their requests in the Selectmen's Office for monies to be raised at Annual Town Meeting in March no later than Dec. 1, 1982.

Rd. Comm. Bean requested that he be allowed to grade Seasonal and Town dirt roads. Turnaround by Stubby Ham's, level piles of gravel at salt shed. Work turnaround at Ross corner and New Road turnaround for snow plowing. This work received Selectmen's approval.
