Selectmen's Meeting

Selectman Woodsome called Mr. Roland Petit of Biddeford to answer his inquiry of the snow plowing by his property on Map 43 Lot 22. Snow being piled ten feet high in his right-of-way. Mr. Woodsome informed Mr. Petit that he should contact Lake Arrowhead Comm., as they plow all the private road ways in Lake Arrowhead.

Dwayne Woodsome on the Agenda, called to cancel out, but will come in on a later date to discuss wood with the Selectmen.

Letters for Bids for the printing of the Town Report to go out to surrounding printers. For the 1982 Report.

Al Bates, a resident from the Town of Alfred in to give his reviews of the Halloween disturbance held at So. Waterboro corner on Oct. 31, 1982. Mr. Bates said he had talked with several residents of Lyman, Biddeford, Saco, Sanford and Alfred and that they were very much against the way the whole thing had been handled. He said that he was in the area and did see some of the action taking place. He felt the law enforcement men done what they had to and that some one could have been killed because of the condition of the road. Rte 202 being a much traveled roadway, paid for by his tax dollars, he did not feel that it should have been in such a mess that the road had to be closed. Both Selectmen Woodsome and Fay maintained that the Town had requested a full investigation of the happenings. And also that an article may have to come before the Townspeople at a Town Meeting. Mr. Bates thanked the Selectmen for their time.

Glenn Bean, Sr. Selectman Woodsome asked Glenn about the grading of the road by Ham's Cove. The office had received complaints that the land owners had to hand shovel their driveways after the grading was completed because the road was left in such a mess. Bean assured the Selectmen that he had fixed the road today.

Cutting wood on the Middle Road for General Assistance: Ed Waterhouse reported that about 8 cord of wood was located at his house. It was decided that the brush left would be pushed over the wall. Selectman Fay said that the costs of the 8 cord of wood was \$60.00 per cord. 78 hours of cutting at 4.50 per hour equaled 351.00, Ed Waterhouse for hauling another 140.00 for a total of 491.00. It was noted that Dwayne Woodsome had offered wood to the Town for 70.00 per cord cut to stove length and delivered. The cutting will continue along the Middle road with the monies to be taken out of the Brush account, with full approval from the Road Commissioner.

Knight Road

Selectman Fay noted that the hearing was being held on the road as it is laid out today not as it was years ago. The Town had received a Petition signed by all abutters that they wished to have the road discontinued. Fay also told the landowners that if they all agreed that the road could be closed off by barricades.

Johnson Road

Selectman Woodsome said that a public easement would remain for the Power Company use. Two people were in for the hearing one a land owner Paul Hutchins and one a prospective land owner, both were against the closing of the road. After a decision is made by the Board of Selectmen a letter to be sent to both Hutchins and Gary McNeill informing them of the Board's decision and whether or not an Article will be placed at Annual Town Meeting for the purpose of the discontinuance of the Johnson Road.

Mansion Road

Much discussion was held on the closing of this road way. Avis Hughey property owner of cultivated blueberries is against the closing. The property has been leased by Mr. & Mrs. Carter of Hollis. Miss Hughey did state, however, to her knowledge the Town had not worked on the road for years, but that the Power Co. had repaired the road way when the Tower was installed up off the Mansion Road, which she and Mr. McNeill said all the deeds referred to the road as "Hooper Hill" road.
