John Cook: Representing the Ross Corner Fire Company in with the bills and a report on the progress of the building in Ross Corner. Unknown Lots: \$1,000. was raised at last Annual Town Meeting for research of the Town's Unknown Lots. Because of the discussion held at the Town Meeting Selectmen have tried to hire someone from out of Town to perform the research. It has been agreed that a letter will be sent to Charlot Lake a resident of Waterboro to ask for her assistance in researching these parcels.

Glenn Bean, Sr.: In with payroll. Selectmen asked about the grading of the East Shore Road. The office had received a complaint from a Mr. Preble. All the Selectmen had reviewed the road. Seectman Fay said he could see no damage. Selectmen Woodsome and Monteith reported that the road had been damaged. Monteith said he felt that the grader was ruining the roads. Bean said he had hired three different operators and the Selectmen were still not satisfied. Mr. Bean left the meeting saying that he could not stay any later.

Selectman Fay reported that the Town's power saw had been damaged and the estimated repairs would be \$120.00.

No desicion on the repairs were made at this time.

Three Thanksgiving Baskets were donated to the Town to be delivered to General Assistance cases. One from GTE,Sylvania , two from the Waterboro Jaycee Women .
