It was noted that Andrew Woodsome, Jr. would not be present due to the illness of his Father.


David Abbott, representing the Waterboro Jaycee's in to request a key for the upstairs conference room to hold the Club's Sunday night meetings in , rather than having to heat the Old Town Hall. Permission given. Also the Jaycees asked permission to erect a Christmas Tree at the Corner Triangle in Center Waterboro. This was done several years ago and they would like to install the anchors before the ground freezes. Permission given.

Copies of all requests received to date will be sent to Finance Committee Chairman Dan Willett, for his review.

Cutting of brush along the Middle Road will be halted because of lack of funds. The Brush account has been overdrawn. When a full Board is present this matter will be discussed again and a decision made, if the Town should sell some of the wood already cut to make money available for more cutting or to wait for Annual Town Meeting. Selectman Fay said, however, that some pine was left along side of the road and should be brought down or it would be in the way of the snow plow. This was voted to be done. Fay to notify Steven Allen to pick the wood up in the morning.

Roger Chick in to discuss the assessment on his personal taxes for Waterboro Country Hardware. Chmn. Monteith said letters had been mailed out to other businesses in Town and some had been received back. Monteith said his suggestion to the Board would be a 30% depreciation each year until value reached 30%. He asked Chick to submit the costs of the equipment he was referring too into the Board's Office for them to review . The letters mentioned above were sent to other businesses in Town that had not been taxed for personal property taxes used in their business. Selectmen present voted to use the above method on Chick's Personl Tax depreciation.
