Selectmen's Meeting.

Town Hall Rentals:

Millard Genthner: Genthner in to make the Selectmen aware of the Law Enforcement Officers in So. Waterboro that are making the Youth move on out of local businesses parking lots. Selectmen were aware of this as the Board had had a meeting with some of the business men involved and had discussed the posting of No Loitering signs in their parking lots. Genthner's concern was that the youth would retaliate against the town or Law Enforcement and have another "Halloween Melee"

Tom Cole: In to discuss with the Board the problem of traveling over the private roads in Lake Arrowhead Estates. Cole said as far as he was concerned there never was a problem, he has always been willing and ready to help anyone coming into Arrowhead to find lots that are for sale, etc. He said that in the past he and others have had problems with groups of 15 to 20 cars from Biddeford/Saco area coming in and had to ask them to leave as it congested the road ways and plugged the marine areas. Any one is welcome to come up and look at lots and he will help if he can.

Swap Pool lots discussed, in making the swap GAI is not or appears not to be taking the old lot out of the owners name and putting it back into the Town's name, therefore, causing the owner to continue to receive tax bills on property they do not own. Cole will check into this matter.



Glenn Bean: Reported that work on the wash outs from the storm of March 19th were coming good. Ossipee Hill Road has one lane for travel at the present time. The other side needs lots of fill, hoping to wait until the Ossipee Hill Project gets underway to use some of the spoil for fill. Woodsome asked that Bean go up by the Max Bass land on the Middle road and place "road closed" signs and also at the other end up by Starr King's property to place another "road closed" sign, because of a wash out by the waterfall.

Ossipee Hill Road: Attending with Selectmen Engineer Walt Stinson, Glenn Bean, Rd. Comm. Douglas Foglio, Contractor. Glenn to contact Keene. The Town will have to purchase some land. Walt to stake required land area. Most of the needed land will be on top of hill in area of ledge. The road will be 5 or 6 feet lower in these areas. Walt and his people assumed Town owns right-of-way, between stone walls. Should make it very clear, what the Town will do for the parties concerned prior to starting the project. Walt & Company will have to stake out entire project prior to negotiating with land owners. Walt to obtain the numbers and etc., from C.M.P. poles that have to be moved.
