

MINUTES

April 12, 1983

Present: Chairman Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Robert Fay, Dennis Abbott, Jean Chick, Glenn Bean

Robert Tutt: Representing the Youth League in to discuss a work weekend to take place at the Ballfield on April 18, 19 & 20th. The Selectmen were in agreement that the Town would again pay for out of the Incidental Account for the field to be mowed and watered. The Town will also pay for a load of Clay, loam mixture to be dropped off at the field and taken care of at the workweekend. The Selectmen did not approve to have the Town pay the expenses of the field being chaulked before each game. The league will have to pay for that out of their monies.

Selectmen Abbott suggested that the Youth League meet with the Parks & Rec. Comm. to discuss and draw up a proposal outlining what the League would like to do. Also Abbott would like a Memo to go to the Parks & Rec. Comm. to have them investigate bring the ball diamond behind the Massabesic Lions Medical Center up to playable specs. And also plans for another ballfield behind the one on the Old Alfred Rd.

Van Foglio was given a go ahead on a tank and cover at the ball field for the water system.

Keys to be made for coaches use of the building located on the Old Alfred Rd. Also the tractor will be taken to Abbott's on Rte. 5 for needed repairs.

\$5.00 fee to be charged each player, to be reimbursed with return of uniform.

Town Hall: Selectmen agreed that while the loam was being hauled into the ball field that some also be dropped off at the Town Hall to be spread around the grounds where needed.

Ossipee Hill Rd: Letters to go to the three lowest bidders informing them that the bid had been awarded to Douglas Foglio. Scott Hoar of the Press Herald will be called with the bid awarding information.

Ledgemere Bridge: Planking from the Bridge owned by the Town of Waterboro discussed and a request had been received from Richard Ferguson to obtain it. Selectmen signed an Agreement giving Ferguson the planking with the understanding that he would remove it all and clean up the area.

Ed Waterhouse: Purchased for \$100.00 the old chunks of Town wood located on his property. He said that eight cords of the wood had been given out for General Assistance and that the remainder of the wood should be hauled down into his sand pit for use next winter for General Assistance. Selectmen will have this taken care of.

Ed was given the authority to install two faucets with keys in hall way for janitorial use.

Waterborough Historical Soc: Selectmen gave their permission for them to man a food table at the SADC #57 Budget voting on May 17th.

Maurice Carter: Selectmen issued Mr. Carter a Concealed Weapons Permit.

Several Lien Foreclosures for 1980 tax signed by the Selectmen.

Glenn Bean: Bean said he will start work on the Middle road hauling in gravel. Seectman Fay asked him to make a turnaround off Andrew's Lane. Bean said that he had purchased a new saw as the other one had needed to be repaired to often. He said that he had talked with John Brock about the Ossipee Hill Rd. being straightened out in front of his property and that Brock was agreeable. Chmn. Woodsome noted that James Therault had requested to be notified of any future meeting when the Ossipee Hill Rd. would be under discussion.

Bean set the figure for storm damage to be any where between \$15,000. and \$20,000. Bean said that 3,000 yards of gravel had been haul to repair roads as of today. Fay asked Bean to clean up the road going up to the dump.

Bean said that the grading of roads would be started soon. Asked by Selectman Fay who would be driving the grader this year and Bean stated that perhaps he would.

Bean was asked to check the following roads, Chadbourne Ridge Rd., Middle road by Ken^r Roberts, up beyond Leo Pillsbury, by Edith Pierce property and also check out the Marchessault drive way.

Shapleigh Selectman, Ruth Ham called Chmn. Woodsome during the meeting to inform him that the Shapleigh Board had canceled their regular Board meeting in order to attend the Roundtable discussion/Workshop meeting with SAD #57 Director's, etc. on April 28th. A news release will go out on the meeting of SAD, Selectpersons. Also John Monteith will be called and asked that the SAD #57 budget be returned to the Town Office to be updated.

TRI-AN Waste Disposal: Paul StHilaire and Dale Blow of Old Orchard Beach in to discuss the possible land fill operation on the Frank Jewett property on the Middle road .They would like to bring the ash from the incinerator from the Saco/Biddeford area and dump it on this property and also give the Town the right to use it as a land fill. Tests have been done and they may pass D.E.P. approval. StHilaire said that they wanted to get the feelings of the Board before going to more expense. The parcel of land they are interested in has 30 acres, only 11 acres are suitable for a landfill. StHilaire said that he had Bob Gerber, formerly employed by Land Use Consultants doing the testing etc., Mr. Gerber had in the past done work for the Town of Waterboro to find landfill sites through Land Use. Selectmen asked for a copy of the report from Gerber so that copies may be made and the Planning Board and Selectmen have a chance to look it over and that St Hilaire come back in two weeks to meet with the Selectmen.

Willis Lord: Reported that the Road Review would meet at the Town Hall next Tuesday evening and that they would need a map of the Town roads to work with. Land Use to be called and a map ordered.

April 28th. meeting with the SAD/Selectmen was discussed and Willis was notified that the meeting would have to be publicized according to M.M.A. Willis said that he had talked with Atty. Harry Prinkle and he said if no decisions will be made, only participants can speak.
