

COUNCIL MEETING
MINUTES

April 19, 1983

Present:

Meeting opened at 8:00 pm., by Chmn. Woodsome. Woodsome announced the new dump hours and the extra cost being \$37.50 per week for the added hours. Woodsome reported that Keene Co. had a crusher set up at the stump dump and had crushed 5,000 yards of gravel for the Town and had purchased 4,000 yards, which would be deducted from the cost of the crusher. Woodsome said that the gravel was some of the best around and would be used on town ways this year. Woodsome informed those present of the Ledgemere Bridge closing for the repairs and also that the Rd. Comm. would go to Limerick and haul back the Town of Waterboro's share of the steel from the old bridge. The Ossipee Hill road Construction project had been awarded to Douglas Foglio, Sr. for \$64,698.00.

Woodsome informed the Council that the Selectmen had set up a Workshop/Roundtable Discussion meeting with the SAD#57, Directors, Dr. Gallucci, Charles Doane Bus. Mgr. and Area Selectpersons for April 28 th. at 7:00 pm., public can attend, but Woodsome not sure at this time if input would be allowed from the public in attendance. John Monteith said that at some time in the near future the old Directors would be setting up a meeting, meaning prior members to the Board, to discuss the problems at the schools. Selectman Abbott stated that the intention of the meeting is to foster better relations.

Planning Board: Hammond reported that the Board is meeting now twice a month. New election of Officers held at last meeting making Russell Keith, Chairman, Roland Denby Vice Chmn. Kathleen Moody Sec/Treas.

ZBA: Chmn. Charlot Lake announced that Notices would go out to hold an election of Officers on May 11, at 7:30 pm.

Charter Comm: Andrew Woodsome, Jr. announced that the Selectmen would be setting a date for the first Charter Meeting later tonight. Notices will be sent out in the mail.

Conservation Comm: Chmn. Langill reported that the Comm. had been on an on-site inspection of the Webber property and that the requests of Ms. Wiggins would be taken care of at the Route 5 property. Fence erected, toilet set up and gravel brought in. He said that he would be looking at other Town owned property and also be checking into some Grant monies that may be available through the Forrestry Dept.

John Monteith said that the Comm. could get in touch with Earlon Morrison of the Soil Conservation Dept. of the State and get help in trim and cutting of Town Forrests.

Roads: Chmn. Woodsome said that the Selectmen had discussed the fact that a Special Town Meeting would have to be held in order to raise monies for Roads and Bridges due to the costs of the Storm damages, that washed out several Town roads. Also at this time the Board may ask for monies to tar the 500 to 600 feet of road by Ledgemere bridge. Selectman Woodsome asked that Selectman Fay measure the area on his way home tonight.

8:30 PM Road Review Committee members joined the meeting. Present; Willis Lord, Chairman, Glenn Bean, Sr., Ed Waterhouse. Chmn. Lord presented a review of the Road Review Comm. meeting that started at 7:30 PM., with a list of roads the Committee felt that needed work.


Chmn. Lord said that he would mark some Town Maps with the roads and the priorities listed. A lengthy discussion of work that needed to be done and costs was held.
