Woodsome reported that a complaint had been voiced by Carlton Huntress about the fire hazard made by the Scouts and Lions leaving brush, etc. after the clearing of the Webber property, owned by the Town, Conservation Chairman Daniel Langill will receive a letter asking him to please check the complaint out and get back to the Board with his findings.


