March 20, 1984

Council Meeting

Meeting opened by Chmn. Fay. Fay announced that he had been made Chairman of the Board last week. He noted that Annual Town Meeting had lasted approx. six hours with 81 Articles on the Warrant. Fay said that a lot of Committee needed new appointments to them. The Board will review the applications submitted next Tuesday evening. Fay explained that Selectman Woodsome had attended Legislature Sessions pertaining to a Bill on changing the voting on the SAD Budget. He said that John Monteith had also attended. Monteith at this time said the contention at the Session from other SAD's that this was a SAD #57 problem, not SAD'S in general that better P.R. work needed as Jon Gale had stated in the past. The Session is to be continued on Friday at 9:30 AM. Monteith said that only five out of the fourteen members of the State Education Committee attended the Session.

Fay said he felt that the Administration of SAD #57 could present the Budget Package in such a way that all citizens could better understand it.

Leroy Darling: At this time Mr. Darling presented a complain on the road conditions on the road he lives on off Webber Rd. He said that he had continually requested that Rd. Comm. Bean repair the road and haul in some gravel and had never been done. Selectmen agreed to have the Road Commissioner look at the road.

SAD #57: Director Jon Gale said he had nothing to report that meetings had been cancelled due to bad weather, Budget to be presented to the entire Board. Over all budget up 13% + over last year.

Planning Board: Mike Hammond reported that the Board is very busy. They have before them now a 7 lot subdivision. They will start meeting twice a month next month.

Glenn Bean Rd. Comm: Still on Winter roads, thinking Spring. Not much can be done on holes in the roads this time of the year. At this time Chmn. Fay informed Bean that the Selectmen had promised Mr. Darling that Bean would look at Darlings road.

Owen Grant: Asked the Board if the Auditor's Report had been checked for the discrepancy questioned at Town Meeting by Steve Kasprzak. Fay said the Town had received a "unclassified" breakdown of expenditures from the Auditor which was available at the Selectmen's Office.

8:30 PM: Members of the Parks & Recreation Comm. joined the meeting. Dianne Holden, Eleanor Roberts, Melvin Day & Emery Isaac.

ZBA: Charlot Lake, nothing to report.

Conservation Comm: Debra Downs Committee member said the Committee would meet with the Board of Selectmen before any water testing would be done using the monies raised at Town Meeting for the tests. Fay said a letter had been received by the Selectmen from the Monsanto Company on the Ricard gravel pit and that the letter indicated that the Company had hired E.C. Jordan Co. to do some testing of the pit. Fay said that the Planning Board would be meeting with Atty. McElhinney to go over the Hazardous Waste Ordinance passed at Town Meeting. The status of D.E.P. vs So. Maine Finishing Corp. was discussed.

Ed Waterhouse: Rabies Clinic to be set up and the dog ordinance enforced.

Millard Genthner: Questioned what had been done about the animal parts being carried around So. Waterboro by dogs. Woodsome said that the C.E.O. had checked this out and that a rendering company was picking up the barrels of parts and that if the State Law was obeyed and dogs kept under owners command they would not have a problem.

Owen Grant: Nothing to report. Selectman Fay asked him about the recent purchase of a new truck by the Fire Dept. and Grant said that he was not at the meeting to report on the Fire Dept.

Park & Rec.: Eleanor Roberts, Chmn. said that they had not had a ^{regular} meeting since Town Meeting. ~~Next regular meeting~~ They will be notified on Saturday whether or not the Youth League would go with a President running the Youth League or as the Parks & Rec. recommended a four manager type structure which had been approved by the Selectmen. Either way the Parks & Rec. Comm. will have charge of the expenditures of monies raised at Town Meeting.

Owen Grant: Grant asked about the old right-of-ways around Ossipee Lake. He said it would be much easier for the Fire Dept to fill their trucks if access to the Lake was available.

Dianne Holden: Reported that she was taking in a lot of tax money.

Mike Hammond: He believed that charges were made against him concerning the Proposed Charter, that he was accused of slipping something in at the last minute. Hammond said anyone could ask the other members and they will say it was voted on. Selectman Woodsome said he was the one that made the charge, that when he left the Charter meeting on a Saturday it was all set and then at a following meeting the language was different and that the Town's attorney had not been consulted and that he (Hammond) had taken it upon himself to make the changes. Hammond said that he would resign from all Town Committees if the Town Officials wished him to.

Chmn. Fay explained that as Town Meeting nears strong opinions seem to heighten and after Town Meeting was over and done he hoped every one could remain friends and work in the best interest of the Town. As one Selectman he would not ask for a resignation.
