

MINUTES

April 3, 1984

Selectmen's Meeting

Present: Chmn. Robert Fay, Dennis Abbott, Andrew Woodsome, Jean Chick, Glenn Bean.

Millard Genthner: Came in to inquiry why he was not appointed to the Finance Committee. Chmn. Fay told him that he did not receive enough votes, when the applications were voted on at the last Selectmen's meeting. Genthner had been appointed to the Industrial Commission for one year term. Genthner said that he did not wish to serve on the Commission.

Roads: Glenn Bean had been asked to attend the meeting to discuss the conditions of the roads and also because it was a vote of the people at Town Meeting that the monies on most of the road Articles be spent under the direction of the Selectmen. Chmn. Fay asked that two loads of gravel be placed on the road up beyond Bob Abbott's. Fay said that Ossipee Hill Rd. will need grading, and that signs must be installed on the Mt. road because of the cable that has been placed across the roads to warn people before an accident occurs. Selectman Woodsome said that there were problems with several of the roads and that Glenn should be out there doing the work. He said that Huntress road was bad, Thnys Mills road by David Michaud was almost beyond use it was in need of repairs. Woodsome said that the problem at the approach of Ledgemere bridge would be looked at by the State Engineers as there was too much ice at the time that they last checked it out. Work is needed in by Chandler Holmes. Glenn said that he had checked the water problem at Oak St. and that the water is coming from across the road and ending up in the drive way of Marchansault. Needs a culvert. Woodsome asked when the work would be done and Glenn said as soon as possible.

Payroll forms discussed a change will be made to show the accounts balances and expenditures and also a 14 day column. Summary section for discretion of how many cords or yards, etc. Selectman Abbott will draw up the new forms.

Seal Coat: Letters to go out to the various companies asking them to submit a formal proposal to the Town on how much they could mix up a cold patch mix in a Town pit. Woodsome said that he had talked with a Gibbson from Commercial Paving and that Gibbson would be willing to come out and talk with the Board on cold patch mix and look at the gravel pit. He said that a figure of \$22,000. <sup>2 inch of cold patch</sup> per mile was given to him by Gibbson and that he would pay \$3.00 per yard for the gravel. Also Woodsome said he had received an offer of the free use of a spreader & roller.

Projects: Town Engineer Walt Stinson joined the meeting at this time he had been meeting up stairs with the Parks & Rec. Comm. Selectmen asked that he have tests done at the lagoons before the Town sold or spread any gravel out of the area. Also bids for the work to be done on Ossipee Hill Road. Stinson was also asked to do a survey of the Town land on Federal St. Selectman Fay said that the road into the Lagoon area should be fenced off so that citizens would not continue to dump their rubbish in there.

Stump Dump: Mr. & Mrs. Richmond Stevens and Dwayne Woodsome attending, Glenn Bean said that before his Contract for the maintenance of the Stump Dump ends he will clean up the area and cover.

Dwayne stated that before he took over the Stump Dump that he would want the area cleaned and covered. Dwayne said that he would have the area open only when the Transfer Station was open, he said he felt that was what the Town's people wanted by attending the hearing held in March. Stevens said that he would be taking loam in within a month

but would put the cable across the entrance to the Stump Dump as soon as possible. Stevens will get Howard Stone a book to keep on people using the Stump Dump and also check the loads as they come into the area.

Woodsome told Stevens that the Town would be tarring the section into the Transfer Station and that the Town planned to set up a section of the new land they would be buying to mix a cold patch in. Stevens asked what the Board wanted done with the mattresses dump there he said in Ogunquit they still burned them but would take them in the box if the Board wanted him to. Woodsome said that would be the best thing to do, since the D.E.P. was against the Town burning them.

Phone calls: Mike Hammond called to inform the Board that he did not want to serve on the Industrial Commission this year.

Larry Moody called to inform the Board that he was going to Arizona for five weeks and that if he was needed on the Fair Hearing Comm. they would have to make a temporary appointment to fill in for him.

Donald Holden and Robert Goodwin were appointed to fill the vacancies on the Industrial Comm.

Office Equip: A new typerwriter will be ordered for the Selectmen's office and the present one being used would be moved to the Planning Board room for the other committees use for typing minutes, etc.
