

MINUTES

April 10, 1984

Selectmen's Meeting

Present: Chmn. Robert Fay, Dennis Abbott, Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Jean Chick.

Victualers Hearing: Held at 7:00 PM. for Country Parts & Equipment to sell food at a public auction on their property on Rte. 202 & 4 in So. Waterboro. Selectman Abbott made the motion to grant the license, seconded by Selectman Woodsome. License approved.

Dorothy Stetson: In to see the Board in regard to the Emery Road in No. Waterboro. She was given copies of the State of Maine Law on discontinuance of public ways and copies of the minutes and material on the hearing held Feb. 10, 1981. It was voted and passed at the Annual Town Meeting held March, 1981 to discontinue the portion of the road in 400 ft. off the Chadburne Ridge Rd. Mrs. Stetson said that she had hired Robert Abbott to haul in gravel this year in order to make the road more passable. Mrs. Stetson also showed interest in purchasing lots at Lake Arrowhead that belong to the Town she was given a copy of the listing of lots available.

Roland Pierce: Roland with his son Dwight and daughter-in-law met with the Board to discuss the water problem on the Hamilton road. Roland also showed the Board pictures he had taken of the area on last Friday. Dwight said that two years ago he almost lost his trailer because of water damage - to the concrete blocks it sets on. The Flood Hazard Maps were reviewed of the area. Several years ago culverts placed in the area by James Hamilton, with Glenn Bean doing the actual work seem to not be large enough and set up too high to take care of the heavy rain water going into the heath. Dwight said that he felt if the ditches were cleaned out and larger culverts set in lower the problem would be solved. The Board will meet at the Pierce residents with the Road Commissioner at 6:00 PM., next Tuesday, April 17th. to review the problem.

Photo Copiers: John Orr representing the Kemco, Inc. explained the machines he could offer the Town. It was decided that after realizing the amount of copying done the Town really was in need for a larger machine, such as the Toshiba #5511, which he would sell the Town for \$2495. with a stand and take the Town's present copier in trade. A maintenance program for \$495. per year for three years unlimited copies. Ninety days parts and labor covered. Drum 100,000 copies, 180,000 fuses oiler and lamp covered. Will bring in larger machine on Friday for Board to use.


Frank Mulkern from Locke Office Products demonstrated the Canon NP-270 will sell the machine to the Town \$3,995. and this also includes a Canon typewriter worth \$795. After much discussion the Board agreed that they would give him a check tonight for \$3,600. for the NP-270, plus the typewriter and copier stand, the Town keep their present copier to be used by the Planning Board. Woodsome asked for a service maintenance contract in writing at this time and Mulkern said he could not do this without first talking to his boss.

A check was written by the Treasurer for \$3,600. for the copier and Mulkern will deliver the machines and stand on Friday. The Machine service maintenance will be .006 per copy.

Jerry Pare: In to talk with the Board concerning the Rescue Department of the Waterboro Fire Dept. He has been the Captain for 2½ years. The Squad now has 23 licensed members with 15 E.M.T's. They recently had a drive on advance payments for Ambulance use and realized \$5,000. at \$15.00 per person. A run to Goodall Hosp. costs \$35., Webber Hosp. \$45., Portland Hosp. \$75. Mmembers of the Rescue or Fire Dept. are not charged for the use of the Ambulance. Abbott asked if the Fire Dept, and Rescue were planning to split, that someone had mentioned to him that the two departments could not get along. Pare said that they had had problems in the past but had pulled together. Woodsome asked Pare when he felt the present Ambulance would need to be replaced and he said within 5 or 6 years. The body of the present Ambulance is in rough shape the doors are sprung, but they can live with it, it has 17,000 miles and a few service problems. He said that he was not living in Town when the Ambulance was purchased but from what he had heard and by checking the paper work over the Ambulance was located setting in a lot in Texas, that possibly some one had ordered and not purchased the Town heard about it and bought it. A new one would go for around \$60,000. Pare said he would like to see a Fund for a new Ambulance. Woodsome said that possiblily an Article could go on the Warrant next Town Meeting.

Discussion was held on the future needs of the Ambulance as far as special equipment.
