

BOARD OF SELECTMEN

Minutes, Regular meeting, May 8, 1984. Present: Chm. Robert Fay, Dennis Abbott, Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Dianne Holden, Glenn Bean, Chauncey Gerry and F. Edward Waterhouse.

The Board went into executive session in regards to a general assistance case.

Animal Control Officers: Constables F. Edward Waterhouse and Chauncey Gerry were in to discuss the dog licensing. Reported that approximately 150 animals were done at the rabie clinic held Sun., May 6. The Town Clerk reported that 30 dogs and 1 kennel license was done at the clinic. The Board feels that the residents of the town have had enough time to get their dogs licensed, therefore the constables are to enforce the ordinance, handing out warnings when necessary. Flyers will also be printed for distribution in regards to licensing and letting dogs run loose, for the constables to distribute.

Lake Arrowhead Lot Bids: Selectmen Abbott talked on the telephone to Carmine Federico who's bid on lot 917 was accepted at last weeks Board meeting. This lot was listed, in error, on the lots available for bidding, and informed Mr. Federico as such. Dianne Holden will update bidding lists.

Stockpile/Cold Mix: Tilcon sent in a revised bid - \$15,712. After a lengthy discussion the Board voted 2-1 to accept Blue Rock's bid of \$12,200. Blue Rock will be so notified.

Seal Coat & Tar: Chm. Fay made the motion that bids for seal coat and tar go out as in the past, with the Board and Road Commissioner reviewing the bids received. Bids to be in by May 22, 1984. Abbott seconded.

Woodsome amended the motion to add that all inquiries be directed to the Road Commissioner. Fay seconded.
(Rd. Comm. Bean agreed to this)

Amended motion voted, passed unanimously.

Conservation Commission: Daniel Langill, Chm., left off a credit application for the Town to complete and return to Sears, Roebuck for the purchasing of fencing at the Webber property. Treas. Holden instructed to complete and return.

Industrial Commission: Board instructed secretary to send out news release looking for more members.

Dump: Woodsome reported that Stevens owner of Custom Transfer has requested that the gates be locked other than open hours for the dump. The road crews are leaving the gates unlocked whenever they are hauling gravel out of the pit area. In discussion with Road Comm. Bean, agreed he will look into using the old Gus Mill Road for hauling out gravel and in the meantime, will close gates while hauling. Also a letter is to go to Stevens in regards to the dumpster being full on Mondays and having to close the dump to change.

Closing of certain roads during winter/spring: Abbott brought up about the damage the 4 wheel drive vehicle are doing to

some of the old roads in town. Secretary to check on procedure of closing roads for Board.

Rt. 5 Picnic Area: Holden reported that a suggestion of the custodian at the High School complex is that speed bumps should be dug down, not mounded up as previously discussed due to the difficulty of snowplowing the area. Rd. Comm. to come back with price for digging speed bumps, plus cleaning out catch basin.

Road Commissioner passed in payroll, Selectmen approved Treasurer's warrant and minutes from May 1, 1984 meeting as well as use of the Town Hall by Roberts on May 26 and Chase on June 16.
