

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

May 15, 1984

Selectman Abbott stayed in the Selectmen's Office to work on preparing a list of "Swap Pool" lots.

The meeting was opened by Chmn. Robert Fay. He announced that a bid had been given out for Cold Patch Mix, to Blue Rock Ind. Fay said that Dwayne Woodsome had taken over the maintenance of the Town Stump Dump. Dwayne said that they were attempting to keep the gate up and to have Howard Stone check the loads coming in, the first week everything was fine, however, from that time on the area has been a mess with citizens dumping garbage into the Stump Dump. There does seem to be some problems, Fay said at the Transfer Station with the Compactor being over loaded on Mondays.

Fay said that the Board would be putting the painting of the Town Hall out to bid soon. Dwayne Woodsome asked at this time how come the Bid for Cold Patch went to the second highest bidder. Fay said that he had voted for Blue Rock Ind. and so hadn't Abbott even though they were higher.

Planning Board: Mike Hammond reported that two subdivisions had been presented to the Board for consideration. A three lot on Route 202 and a one lot off Silas Brown Rd. Also several building permits that have to come before the Board have been considered. Planning Board will be administering the new Hazardous Waste Ordinance and that the Industrial Comm. was compiling a list of all businesses in Town that should be contacted in regards to the Ordinance.

Larry Moody: Nothing to report, Larry has been in Arizona for five weeks.

Donald Turner: He has been appointed as Chairman. The Comm. will be compiling a list of the businesses in Town and material in hopes to have a brochure printed on the Town. Meeting next Tuesday evening. Need more members.

Owen Grant: Pointed out that if the Town had a Hazardous Waste accident at the So. Maine Finishing Plant the Fire Dept. would have no idea what they were fighting. They have never been allowed to enter the plant to check out the materials used. They have visited GTE and been shown the materials used within that Plant. He said the Fire Dept. could use a list of all hazardous materials in Town.

Dorothy Stetson: Nothing to report.

Roland Oakes: Nothing to report. Chmn. Fay said that the Planning Board would be using the Road Review Comm. in the future.

Tom Cole: He has been attending the meetings of the Saco River Corridor Comm. he said that they past four building permits this last meeting and held a hearing on the debris left from the approach construction to the Ledgemere Bridge. Glenn Bean was given permission to dump the debris and now Lake Arrowhead Comm will have the area smoothed out and be in compliance with SRCC. Woodsome said that he had been approached about the problem by LAC. Manager Pocarol and that the job was given to Bean as a private contractor, therefore, the Town had no responsibility in the clean up or leveling. Cole said that Rollins was still Chairperson and Margaret Roy still the Exc. Director of SRCC.

Eliz. Smith: Nothing to report.


Dan Langill: The Conservation Comm. is working on the Wet Lands Inventory the D.E.P. asked the Town's in MAINE to conduct. They have set June 2 or 9th as work days at Ossipee Pines (Webber Property) the first date if the weather is good will be used. They need to burn brush and have contacted the Fire Chief and been told that there would be no problem. Also will be cutting out the road. Have hired a Contractor to install the fence. On Arbor Day they plan to have the Girl Sout and Brownie Troops to plant trees.

Water Tests around Town that have been done previously will be studied, information coming from D.E.P. They met with Hollis Conservation Comm. last month, plan to meet with all the surrounding Town's to get ideas of their work. At last night's meeting a new Chairman was elected, Debra Downs and Carmine Castaldo as Secretary.

John Gale: Gale reported that the SAD would conduct a deaster drill next month with the Ambulance, Fire Dept., State Police, Sheriff's Dept. using a bus on the West Road. It will be a simulated bus accident they will be using the Scouts, this will take place around four in the afternoon. A group of evaluators will be present to log all that happens, in which Gale will be one. This same thing was done in Wells two years ago and proved helpful.

Gale said that SAD #57 had bought a new bus for \$27,000., which will be reimbursed over a period of twelve months and in reality cost the SAD \$1,300. A lengthy discussion was held on the reason the Directors did not notify the citizens. Gale said that the State has allocated millions of dollars for transportation and at the end of each year they have some money left over because some Town's do not purchase as many buses as they asked for, SAD #57 asked for six buses only was allocated enough money for four. Now the State has money left and asked SAD #57 if they wished to purchase another bus, which will be used for handicapped children. He said that part of the Directors job was to make decisions like these and they made the decision.

Don Turner: Asked why the State graded the roads after the Town had and the State had left a mess in front of each Town road and citizens driveways. Selectman Woodsome said he would call the State and complaint about this.
