

COUNCIL MEETING
MINUTES

Feb. 19, 1985

Meeting opened by Chmn. Fay. Fay said that the necessary public hearings had been held on the amendment to the Crosswalk Ordinance and the proposed Smoke Detector Ordinance, which will be voted on in Article form on March 9th. Fay said that Saco River Communications would be in the office on Feb. 28th. at 7:00 Pm to tape the Board and a member of the Finance Comm. explaining the ARTICLES on the Warrant for Annual Town Meeting of which there are 78. Fay explained also that the Board would recommend that the winter snowplowing contracts be let out in three sections for a five year period. As it stands now Fay said that Robert Abbott would be awarded the Northern Section; Dwayne Woodsome the East Section, and Douglas Foglio, Sr. the Southern Section. This of course would be subject to Town Meeting approval of monies needed to be raised.

Finance Comm: John Monteith the Committee Chairman said the Committee held six meetings and recommended that less monies be raised than last year. Monteith was questioned by Ed Waterhouse on the way the Committee recommended that the reconstruction of the Clark's Bridge Rd. be done. Monteith said the Committee wanted to be an Engineers report before the work was started and that the Committee recommended \$4,000. for this to be done. Then Monteith said the Selectmen can ask for monies to do the job in 1986. Monteith said that he hoped that the citizens were informed that this project may take more than one year, as the Ossipee Hill Rd did, he said many citizens were not aware that the Ossipee Hill Rd would be reconstructed in three phases initially.

Constables: Both present commented on the Town Officials dogs not being properly licensed.

At this time Chmn. Fay said that the former owners of the New England Hide Co. building in So. Waterboro had been notified to get the remaining barrels and pump several tanks on the property removed. The State, Woodsome said will not intraven because the waste has been classified as Industrial Waste and not Hazardous Waste, therefore, it is left up to the Town to pressure the Company to remove the materials.

Chmn. Fay also said that he did not know if a Candidates Day would be held before Town Meeting, Fay said that he would not have anything to do with it as he is a candidate this year for Selectman. Fay said that for Selectmen, Jeffery Abbott and himself; Rd. Commissioner, Glenn Bean, Sr.; Robert Abbott; Allan Roberts, For SAD Director Frank Hemphill and Carmine Casteldo.




SAD #57: Director Jon Gale reported that he was a member of the Budget Committee and that the proposed budget would be a 15.5 increase over last year, however, Gale said that would mean an impact of 2.3 for the Town of Waterboro. This year the school will be receiving a larger levy of monies from the State. He said through the meeting held thus far the Administration had been cut by \$30,000. and that Transportation/Maintenance would be worked on for cutting tomorrow night. A lengthy discuss was held on hiring Guidance Directors for the Elementary grades. Also discuss was the length of Dr. Gallucci's contract, salary, etc. Selectman Woodsome asked if the rumors that he had heard about the bus drivers forming a Union was correct, Gale not sure but would not be surprised. Gale said that some of the bus drivers have been attending every meeting that transportation was discussed and that they would receive from 9 to 19% increase in pay.

John Monteith brought up the new formula of the State that the more a SAD spends the more they receive from the State. Monteith said the Town's should be aware that in a few years the State would be pulling out leaving the burden upon the taxpayers.

Dianne Holden: Reported that she had sent out approx. 100 Foreclosure Notices for 1982 taxes.

Industrial Dev. Comm.: Evelyn Wishart reported that the Committee met with Wade Junkins to discuss his plans to expand. and that the Committee continues to work on getting a Bank to come into Waterboro.
