Chairman Dennis Abbott opened the meeting. Abbott reviewed several bids that had been accepted by the Town. Seal Coat & tar bid accepted last Tuesday awarded to Scott's Paving, due to start work in June. Stump Dump bid awarded to Clarence Woodsome, Jr. Handicapped accessibility renovations by J.K.I General Contractors out of Gorham, Maine. Abbott noted that Van Foglio would be "Clerk of the Works".

Chmn. Abbott reported that appointment and reappointments to the various Town Committees. Abbott asked that if anyone knew of someone that would like an appointment please let the Board know.

Abbott said that the snow plowing contracts should be ready by the end of the month and that the Pug Mill bids were due in on the 30th of April.

Abbott said that Regional Waste System had awarded the contractor to a builder and that a special meeting would be held in Portland next Tuesday and that the Town would have to have Town Meeting approval to change the contract the Town has.

Abbott said that the public hearing held this evening on a malt license for Li'L Al's Pizza Barn, application will be signed pending verification of enough parking area after owner Berube meets with the Planning Board. Also he stated that the Board would be quick to revoke the license if any problem should come up in the future.

Town Clerk: Dianne Holden reported that she was updating the voters lists and had sent out 425 delinquent tax bills out on 500 pieces of property, she noted that she had had good response.

Road Commissioner: Glenn Bean, Sr. reported that he would have roads ready for seal coating the first of June.

SAD: Jon Gale said that the Waterboro informational meeting on the SAD budget vote would be held at the Elementary School in East Waterboro on May 9th. Voting will take place on the 14th. of May. He said that the Town of Waterboro's increase would be 3%, with a 16% increase in the budget over last year's. Gale said that he is on the SAD Finance Committee and that each of the Departments come in with their budget requests and the Committee cuts new items if they feel they are not necessary. They cut \$250,000. off the unfunded list but after discussions, etc. they re-added \$175 to 185,000. back on the budget. A lengthy discussion was held concerning the school.

Fire Dept: No members present. Chmn. Abbott noted that the ad for the Smoke Detector Ordinance was in the Budget Saver Press and if anyone had any question regarding this they should call the number listed.

Planning Board: Secretary Mike Hammond the Board had not as yet elected new officers for lack of a full Board. Hammond said the Board had accepted a new subdivision up on the Chadbourne Ridge Rd.

Finance Committee: Monteith had nothing to report as the Finance Committee will not be meeting for sometime unless something special comes up.

Parks & Recreation: Dianne Holden reported that the Commission was having Chris Staples do some work at the building at the ball field at the Old Alfred Rd. and that Doug Foglio would start soon on the ground work that he had been contracted to do. The Boy Scout Troop will be cleaning the Dugout and painting. Bids have been sent out the contractors for rubbish pickup at the Picnic Area on Rt. 5 and the ball park on the Old Alfred Rd. The Commission will also be putting a sign up at the Town Hall to advertise meetings and etc. that would be taking place at the Hall.

Industrial Development Comm: Secretary Evelyn Wishart reported that they had elected a new Chairman, Donald Holden. That William Welch had started his expansion, the Committee had worked with Welch last year.

Road Review: This Committee has not met yet, had nothing to report. Mrs. Dorothy Stitson at this time thank everyone for the reimbursement that the Stetson's received on work that had paid for on the Emery Road.



ZBA: Nothing to report.
