July 2, 1985.

Selectmen's Meeting

Present: Chrnm. Dennis Abbott, Andrew Woodsome, Jr, Jean Chick (Selectman Robert Fay, out of Town on business, called the office at 8:00 pm, to inquiry about the meeting and talked with Chrnm. Abbott).

SAD #57:Chrnm. Abbott telephoned Joseph Finnigan, Chrnm, SAD #57 Board of Directors. Abbott inquired about a letter that SAD Directors have to send to the Town notifying the Town of Jon Gale's resignation from the Board. This letter by State Status must come to the Town before a new member can be appointed. Mr. Finnigan said the letter would be sent, that the delay was because Gale had said he would serve until the Selectmen made their appointment.

LABids: All available lots that the Town of Waterboro owns were bid on by Kent Lewis, Larry Penna & Herbert Giandario. The bids to be awarded to the highest bidder. The Board voted to extend the time limit on payment of June bids until July 9th., due to the 4th. of July holiday.

Lots 1374, 1642 & 1643 , 1637:

Lot 1374, is now being research by Anne Ponizetti, she will be given extra time, to pay.

1642 & 1643 , these two lots received two bids in June highest by one dollar by John Kustron. If Kustron decides not to purchase the second bidder has been given a chance to pick these two lots up, Van Foglio, he was the other bid.

1637: this lot bid accepted submitted by Smyth & Murphy, second in line would be Kustron.

Town Dump: Mr. & Mrs. Richmond Stevens, owners of Custom Transfer Co., contractors that haul the Town's waste to RWS stopped by the office to discuss the continuing problem of people dumping waste at the Transfer Station during closed hours.

As the Board was discussing this matter, Clinton Woodsome and Clarence Woodsome, Jr. stopped by. Clarence is the Contractor that maintains the Stump Dump. He had been asked to attend a Selectmen's meeting to discuss the steel and metals that are in the Stump Dump.

The Steven's seemed concerned about their Insurance coverage , when the dump is not opened.

Selectman Woodsome made the motion that the Town hire a Deputy Sheriff to be at the Dump during closed hours, Monday afternoon, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday. But that this not be in affect for two weeks giving the Board time to advertise this warning in the newspapers and the Budget Saver Press. Seconded by Abbott.

The Board feels that this would also help the Stump Dump attendant out as well, some of the steel, etc. is being dumped at off hours. Woodsome was informed about the possibility of DEP coming down hard on the Town if they were aware of the steel problem.

The possibility of the Town placing a dumpster of some sort at the gate was discussed and the contention was that the Town would have a problem

with over dumping, not bothering to enter the dump and using the dumpster, how to unload, etc.

Also discussed was changing the gate at the entrance to the dump. Placing wooden beams in the ground and attaching either one large gate or two small ones to make the gate larger to accommodate a large truck.

Buddy Woodsome mentioned the fact that he felt that Howard Stone the Dump attendant was doing a good job, he is very busy. He tries to have the people dump in the right area.


Selectman Woodsome called Deputy Sheriff Bruce Woodsome and asked about the Town hiring a Deputy to tend the dump on closed hours, Bruce said no problem, he could furnish a man for the cost of \$10.00 per hour.

Selectman Woodsome reported that he had heard from Lesley Leighton regarding to the dumping of materials across the road from the dump on Dorothy Wakefield property. Leighton said that he was sorry this happened and would clean the area up, one of his workers made the mistake.

Selectman Woodsome informed Clarence Woodsome, Jr. that it was his job to pick out the steel and iron after burning.

Clarence Woodsome, Jr. said that he would like to have a road put in for people to drive down around to dump at the Stump Dump, there is one now which should be built for travel, removing some large rocks and dumping more gravel. This would avoid the dumping from up at the top, Selectman Woodsome said that Walt Stinson should be asked to lay out a good road way .
