

## MINUTES

November 19, 1985

Board of Selectmen's Meeting

Present: Chrmn. Dennis Abbott, Andrew Woodsome, Jr., Robert Fay, Jean Chick

Hamilton Rd: Selectman Fay reached the Town's Engineer Walt Stinson and requested that Stinson start on the flaging of the area on the Hamilton Road that needs to be brushed out in order to reconstruct a portion of the road. The Board, since no record of laying out the Hamilton Road can be found are going by State Law that this road is 1½ rods from the center of the road on each side.

Stockpile: Selectman Woodsome met with the Representative from DEP on the Town's property off the Bennett Hill Rd. where the Town proposes to place a winter stockpile of salt and sand. Mr. Woodsome received a verbal approval to locate the sand and salt pile at Gus Mill Rd. on Town property, letter to follow from DEP. Selectman Woodsome made the motion that the Town call Central Maine Power Co. to have a pole and light placed at the area of the stockpile.

Hourly pay: Road Commissioner Bean questioned the hourly rate the Town of Waterboro paid trucks for hauling and sanding. Bean said that they now pay per Town Meeting vote \$1.00 over State wages. Bean said some Town's are paying 4 to 5.00 over State Wages. Several Town's will be called to find out their rate of pay.

Gravel Crushing: Selectman Woodsome met with a representaive from the National Guard's at the Town property off the Bennett Hill Rd. and Woodsome reported that the Stg. that met with him told him his boss would be out to look at the area. However, Woodsome said that right now plans are that the Guards set up from June 13 to June 27 and will bring 15 men. They are requesting use of showers for the 15 men. The Board will contact the school and ask if they can use the showers.

Fire Lanes: Rd. Comm. Glenn Bean, Fire Chief Charles Drapeau, Snowmobile Club members Paul Rocray, Kevin Thiereault, Russell Wright, Paul Laroux met to discuss Goerge Cameron's request that the culvert on the Thyng's Mill s Rd. over Henderson Brook be repaired. Paul Rocray said that the Club members had checked this matter out and that prospective land buyer Richard Cote, Jr. had apparently removed the steel bridge that the Club used for a trail bridge, not Cameron. Russell Wright asked, what if the Town spent money up there and then Cameron says no more snowmobilers. The goup was left at this time to discuss the matter amount themselves.

Annual Town Meeting: The Board set the amounts on several of the money articles to present to the Finance Committee at their next meeting for the Committee's recommendations.

The Board will place an article on the Warrant for the Historial Society to waive the remaining \$2,000. due as terms of their lease on the Belval property.

The Board agreed to place on referendum vote whether the Town's people would like to change the spelling of Waterboro to Waterborough.


The Board will meet with Assessor Mark Caldwell and the Waterboro Industrial Development Commission tomorrow night to discuss the Town's personal property taxes.
