

## MINUTES

December 17, 1985  
Board of Selectmen's Office

Food Basket: Boy Scout Troop #306 presented Chrmn. Abbott with a food basket for Christmas, the basket will be delivered to a needy family. Troop members present were, Richard Bear, Sr. Assist. Scout Master, Richard Bear, Jr. Sr. Patrol Leader, Brian Rouillard, Pantha Patrol and Robert Bear Raccoon Patrol. Scout Master Michel Rouillard was unable to attend.

Stump Dump Bids: Four bids were received. Dwayne Woodsome submitted three (1) To run the Stump Dump (to DEP specs to date) for \$500. a month or \$6,000. a year. (2) To run the Stump Dump (to DEP specs to date) for the sum of \$450. a month or \$5,400. per year. Providing the Town will build a wall of gravel on the front, east side and the back side of existing Stump, Dwayne drew a diagram of what he thought should be done for work. (3) Will run the Stump Dump the way it has been run in the last year (burn Stump Dump, push to back, cover with out DEP 4 or 5 inch gravel cover or to pick all the steel out of Stump Dump) for the sum of \$350. a month or \$4,200. a year.

Clarence Woodsome, Jr. submitted a bid for \$6,500.00 for the year. Dwayne Woodsome said that he thought the wall he suggested would cost the Town \$800. to \$1,000. to build.

The Board took no action on the above bids.

Tax Anticipation Bids: Two bids were recieved. Norstar Bank at 6.8%, Key Bank at 6.34%. Chrmn. Abbott made the motion that the Town accept Key Bank's bid with the stipulation that the Bank be called and verification made that the Town would receive the same interest service as last year. Voted and passed.

Conservation Comm: Chrmn. Debra Downs, Susan Rose, Neil Raymond met with the Board to discuss the water testing they had performed. They feel that they should have professional help as it seems to be over their heads. A copy of reports from the testing done at Cook's Brook was given to the Board for their review. Neil Raymond said that Cad showed up quite high as .01 Cd is acceptable for drinking water and their testing showed .23 Cd. The Board told them to request help and it was decided that if EPA plans to come into Town and test then they wouldn't be much sense in duplicating of tests.

Resignation: The Board received a resignation from Planning Board Member Charlot Lake stating that she was resigning as of Jan. 1, 1986.

The Board met with the Road Commissioner and Contractor Dwayne Woodsome concerning the complaints received by the Board on the conditions of the roads caused by the last storm.

The Board adjourned their meeting and attended the Council Meeting.
