Meeting opened by Chrnm. Dennis Abbott. Abbott reported on the Annual Town Meeting. He said that totals raised were \$211,782.28 + sum Suff's. from Taxation; \$22,000. from Fed. Rev. Shg.; \$169,010.00 from Excise Tax; \$28,000.00 from Block Grant; \$199,550.00 from Surplus.

Abbott said that the SAD Budget was set and that the Town's cost would be over one million dollars, this is an increase of \$125,000. over last year.

Abbott said that members were needed for several town committee's. There are three new committee's this year coming out of Town Meeting, Hazardous Waste Commission; Computer Selection Committee & Task Force Committee on recycling storage facilities.

Water testing of the Ramsell property and the Barlette Brook will be done and also private wells and Cook's Brook. The testing will be extensive and, therefore, will be expensive. Testing to be done on March 22nd. by Bob Dennett of Peck Lab, he will be accompanied by Neil Raymond a member of the Conservation Commission.

Town Clerk: Reminders to taxpayers on unpaid taxes for 1985 will be sent out soon. Dianne Holden said that she would be issuing the new plates starting in April of 1987. She said that if anyone wished to keep the number showing on their plate at the present time there will be forms available to request this and will cost \$5.00 extra.

Road Comm: Fred Fay said that there is not much sand and salt left, real bad weather this last week. He has cleaned out culverts on the Deering Ridge Rd. all of which needed to be cleaned as they were almost plugged. Lots of work to do, hasn't had any problems, made sure the bus routes were sanded.

Fire Dept: Chief Drapeau said that on April 14th. the DEP would be holding a training session on hazardous waste. So. Hollis, Alfred and Goodwins Mills Fire Dept's. have been invited to attend the session. To date there have been 27 fire calls, 6 of the structure fires in 1986. Last week two awards were given out to Firemen Of The Year. One of the awards went to Frank Birekmose, Jr. for saving a man in a house fire in Kennebunk, this happened while Birekmose was at work in Kennebunk.

Planning Board: Larry Jacobsen said that the Board had turned over some things to the Town's attorney's office, subdivisions that needed to be defined.

Parks & Rec.: Dianne Holden reported that Parks made \$195. on the food table at Annual Town Meeting. August 15th. will be Waterboro Day at the Maine Guides At the Ball Park in Old Orchard. Parks has hired Robert Reny for \$850. for the season to mow, jack of all trades, carpentry and tend the ball park.

Industrial Dev. Co: Chrnm. Don Holden said that at the IDC's last meeting they prepared for Town Meeting, they received the monies they requested, They had several projects, placing Ad's in a pocket guide, expand the business index. The Commission has received two resignations. At the April meeting he plans to introduce two people that were interested in becoming members. Election of Officers will be held in May, Will be getting quotes on the Business Brochure.

Rd. Review Comm: Chrnm. Foglio said that the Committee would need to discuss some problems of work done that still has problems and hope for more progress.

ZBA: Nothing to report.

Constables: No problem, every thing going smooth, per Ed Waterhouse.

Conservation Comm: Member Doris Dyer said that DEP had met with the Commission and that they would make a presentation to the Selectmen.


Bicentennial Comm: Dianne Holden reported that the next meeting would be held Wednesday, May 13th. They have placed orders on coins, plates and that the Cook Book would be sent to be printed next week.

General Discussion: Millard Genthner said that he had questions for the SAD #57 Director's but they were not at this meeting. The Director's Carmine Castaldo, Brenda Charland and Judy Carll had met with the Board of Selectmen earlier and had stayed downstairs for a meeting among themselves. They were asked to come up stairs to the Council Meeting.

Genthner asked why they voted to give Supt. Gallucci and Bus, Manager Charles Doane a 8% increase in pay. Carmine said that the average pay for Supt. in the area was \$50,000. had nothing to compare with, he requested more but the Director's turned it down. Genthner also questioned the \$40,000. office renovations, how come no other member would second a motion made to discuss this matter. A lengthy discussion was held on the SAD #57 schools.

Judy Carll had made the statement that SAD #57 was the 11th. largest school in the State. Foglio questioned this and Carll said that she would check this out. Foglio said that he felt the District should be split. Foglio said also that the building committee is always being informed that the addition to the high school is on schedule, then how come one worker was fired from the job because they were months behind schedule. Castaldo said that he was on the Bldg. Comm. and assumed that they were receiving the true information on the schedule of work on the addition.
