

MINUTES

October 28, 1986

Present: Robert Fay and Dennis Abbott, Selectmen. Andrew C. Woodsome, Jr. Chrm. of the Board. Ernie Cragin, Contractor. Mr & Mrs. Robert Linscott, concerned citizens.

Ernie Cragin: Robert Fay motioned to add a leanto to the Salt Shed to house the new tractor and to keep it away from the salt. Cragin Builders estimated it would cost approximately \$3,500. to construct this building. The subject will be put on hold for the time and brought up again at the 1987 Town Meeting. It was suggested that prehaps a tarp should be purchased to put over the tractor for the time being.

Linscott:

The Linscotts live next door to the Waterboro Motor Cross Scramble Track. They appreciate the traffic signs the town posted in regards to their last and first complaint. They are presently concerned with the "landfill" dumping which has taken place at the Track.

Andrew C. Woodsome, Jr. informed them of the present situation; The town attorney has enforced an injunction to cease the all dumping operations. The hearing will be October 29, 1986 at 9:00 A.M. in Alfred Superior Court. Mr. Owen, motor cross owner, has agreed to clean-up the waste by November 27, 1986. The injunction is to act as a safeguard to a possible delay in properly disposing of the debris. Mr. Linscott reported there were three cabins in the motor cross parking lot. A.C.Woodsome, Jr. motioned to have the CEOinvestigate as to if they have permits or need permits for these cabins.

Steve Pellitier has jurisdiction in this "dumping" matter. The DEP will be satisfied if the motor cross is cleaned up by November 27, 1986. The Town and the Landfill Ordinance will also be content.

Mr. and Mrs. Linscott must take civil action if they feel thsy have suffered damages. Mr. Linscott also mentioned the problem with speed and drunk driving, he was told by the board to take this matter up with the Sheriffs Dept.

Mr. Fay motioned and A.C.Woodsome, Jr. seconded to hold a Public Hearing before relicensing and opening of the motor track. The Town will be sure to invite the Sheriff Dept, the Linscotts and the State Police.
