

COUNCIL MEETING

November 18, 1986

SELECTMENS REPORT;

A.C. Woodsome, Jr. mentioned to the Council the possibility of having a geological study done at the Leather Mill.

A review was made of the Motor Cross Dump. The Board has agreed to let Mr Owen burn stumps and wood debris on his property with supervision paid for by him. Other materials must be hauled off to a legal landfill. The court date has been postponed until sometime in January. The injunction is still in effect. The Court will decide on fines. Mention was made that the DEP has changed their 1 acre jurisdiction.

S.A.D. 57;

Judy Carll reported that they are on budget except for insurance. General Liability has increased \$9,000. and property liability has increased \$13,000. They are looking for a new Insurance Company.

The Board needs a 2/3 vote to decide what to do with the soon to be old Alfred School. The Town of Alfred would like it back. A.C. Woodsome, Jr. suggested to them to pass a "blanket" vote that would allow various towns to automatically take over their old schools instead of voting on each individual situation. Judy will bring this to the Board.

The Special Education budget is \$120,000. in the red They have gone to the State for monies.

A telephone log is being kept at the school. They are trying to find a less expensive phone system. Pam L'Heureux suggested checking into a toll ban.

PLANNING BOARD;

Larry Jacobsen reported that the meetings of November 27 and December 25, 1986 have been cancelled because of the holidays.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Millard Genther suggested that it is about time for them to begin their meetings. note Selectmen's 11-18-86 Minutes.

ROAD REVIEW COMMITTEE:

Ed Waterhouse reported that everything was going along smoothly.

ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS:

Wayne LeBlanc reported that they had heard 2 cases prior to the Council Meeting. The first "Dugas" was passed and approved. The second "Gendron" was tabled until assistance could be gained from Karen Lovell.

According to a newspaper article there are only 5 towns in Maine with "perfect" Zoning Ordinances that would hold up in the courts. Wayne will contact one of these towns for a copy of their book.

CONSTABLES:

Ed Waterhouse reported that everything was fine.

HAZARDOUS WASTE COMMISSION:

Pam L'Heureux reported that they are presently reviewing Jim Gerry's application for his paint shop.

The committee would like to observe Stu Gannett's business on Route 5. A letter will be written to him from Atty. Patterson.

The committee is short one member if they can get a letter or resignation they will replace the non active person.

An inspection was made at the Motor Cross Dump and it appeared that there were no hazardous materials present.

Dorothy Stetson reported some possible illegal dumping taking place on Edgecomb Road. A.C. Woodsome Jr. will check it out.

BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE:

Ken Corthell reported that the post cards are in and available for sale. The Post Office will be dating them the second Wednesday of December at a location not known at this point in time.

The memorial stone is supposed to go in Friendship Park but they are tossing around the idea of putting it in front of the Historical Society Building. A ballpark figure of \$600. was given to level off the rock and adhere the plaque.
