BOARD OF SELECTMEN:

Andrew C. Woodsme, Jr told the Council that they have completed alot of their budget package and submitted it to the Finance Committee.

PLANNING BOARD:

Dwayne Woodsome, reported that 2 new subdivisions have come in.

John Monteith suggested an Article pertaining to Public Water for the Town or for at least part of the Town. Andrew C. Woodsome, Jr. told him that Moody Pond has already been tested as a source of public water. The test results show that Moody Pond could be a good source of water.

Millard Genter reminded Andrew C. Woodsome, Jr of the meeting he talked about with the citizens of Pearl St. Andrew C. Woodsome, Jr. said that possibly the meeting will be held in the first part of the new year.

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE:

Lucille Cortshell reported that they would like Parks and Recreation to join forces with them for Ossipee Pines Tentative Opening Day Ceremonies are set for July 5, 1986.

HAZARDOUS WASTE COMMITTEE:

Ray Dyer reported that he spoke with James Gerry for Downeast Garage. Mr Gerry does not need a hazardous waste permit.

Mr Dyer has been at the N Waterboro Motor Cross Dump while they have been burning. Mr Dyer stated that progree is slow. They must seperate all thematerials and burn the wood only. There seems to be nothing hazardous there just alot of rags, wood, rubber and paper.

Timothy Nelson, Code Enforcement Officer told the Council that on January 5 or 6 Attorney Karen Lovell has set a court date for Mr Owen form the Dump.

Timothy Nelson also told the Council that he has injUNCTION papers on for Leighton Escavating, Lucas Tree and Land Locked Lobster Shed.

BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE:

Andrew C. Woodsome, Jr reported that progress if going good. all the committies are working hard. They need alot of help and would like more members to join.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

Willis Lord met with the County Commissioners to discuss their 1987 budget. The Budget is up 1 million Dollars form 1986. They do expect possibly 2 cuts, 1. 160 thousand for Care of Prisoners and 2. for 130 thousand for the special drug Task Force. Most of the monies are going to the jail, the Sheriff Dept and for salary increases. York County Community Counseling Services were cut by 20 Thousand Dollars.

If anyone has legislation to present Willis needs it by Dec. 29, 1986. He thinks he may put a bill in concerning dumps.
