

SELECTMEN'S MINUTES

January 13, 1987

PRESENT: Sel Dennis Abbott, Sel Robert Fay, Chairman Andrew C Woodsome, Jr
Individual people listed below.

BUNTING: The Board agreed to give the T/C permission to purchase "bunting"
for the Town Hall.

TIMOTHY NELSON, ASSISTANT CEO: The CEO would like to replace their failing
photocopier. Sel Abbott and Sel Fay gave permission allowing
him to purchase a new copier in the amount of 1235.00. The
funds will be taken out of the the Office Supply Account and
will be replaced by the receipts of the CEO. (Chrm Woodsome, Jr
was out in the Town Hall Auditorium wrapping up the DEP Meeting.
RE: 1/13/87 tapes labeled DEP and seperate minutes of that meeting).

STUART GANNETT: Robert Fay motioned to send Mr Gannett a note asking him to
disregard the bill sent to him form the town concerning RWS. Sel
Abbott seconded the motion.

FRED FAY, ROAD COMMISSIONER: The Road Commissioner discussed with the Board
the following subjects:

- (1) Roger Caouette and Robert Abbott:
Independent Snow Plow Contractor Robert Abbott could
not turn his snowplow around near the Caouette home because
cars were in the way. Apparently, Mr Caouette and Mr Abbott
exchanged words. To try and solve this problem Fred
will put up some "NO PARKING TOW AWAY ZONE" signs.
- (2) BAGLEY ROAD: Robert Abbott showed a resident of
that street where to park during a storm several
times. If she does not properly park, he will not
plow that area.
- (3) Fred is leaving town from 1/16/87 until 1/19/87.
Ken Roberts will take his place.
- (4) PHIL GARDNER: Mr Gardners paper box was hit by the
plow a while back. Fred feels it was not the
Contractors fault.

LIABILITY INSURANCE-SNOW PLOW CONTRACTORS: Copies of all liability insurance
policies are in, (1) D Woodsome, 500,000. (2) D Foglio
350,000. (3) R Abbott 50,000. The contract request that each
contractor carry 500,000. worth of liability insurance.
Sel Abbott feels the Board should address this insurance
problem. Chrm Woodsome, Jr and Sel Fay both agree.
A call will be made to MMA asking their advice in this matter.
Also, asking them the role of the Maine Torte Claims Act
in any liability suit.

ELECTRIC HEATERS: Sel Fay and Sel Abbott agreed to contact Atkinson Electric
to install the heaters in the Town Hall Auditorium.

MOODY POND: The Board agreed to submit an article to Town Meeting requesting a moratorium on Moody Pond. Atty Lovell has written the article and copies of it will be sent to the Finance Comm.

COMMITTEE APPLICATIONS: The applications to join various town committees will be published in the Budget Saver until the 2nd week of March.

COMPUTER RUN OFF LABELS: Real Estate Agencies have approached the Town asking to purchase computer address labels of Waterboro Residents. Robert Fay motioned that there is a market for labels and we should check with other towns for the price they charge. Sel Abbott agreed. A survey will be made.

TOWN MEETING: Sel Fay motioned to have the Town Auditor at the Town Meeting. Sel Abbott seconded.

DWAYNE WOODSOME, SNOW PLOW CONTRACTOR: After receiving the letter sent from the Board on 1/6/87 to all the Contractors, D. Woodsome highlighted a few specific items in the contract that pertain to the number of trucks on the road. Sel Fay has sent all materials to Atty Roger Elliott to review and end the confusion. Sel Abbott agreed it was a good idea to have Roger look it all over. Sel Fay suggested that there may be a loop hole in the contract. Sel Abbott agreed it was a little unclear.

NEIL RAYMOND, CONSERVATION COMMITTEE., GARY WESTERMAN ENVIROLOGICAL DATA INC.

Sel Fay contacted Mr Westerman from Envirological Data in connection with assessing the future health problems of the town due to the surrounding pollution. (contaminated wells, SMF, the old tannery, etc...).

Mr Westerman met with the board and will look at information in the files to determine if now is the time for him to be able to give an accurate and valid theory on potential health dangers in the Town of Waterboro. Mr Westerman is going to mull over the information the Town and the DEP has at this point, it may be a little immature to do a study now, but he is going to research it more...

Mr Westerman did attend tonights DEP meeting and suggested to the Board that to gain federal assistance and to get things going a little faster they may have to meet with a higher level of DEP authority.

Sel Fay asked Mr Westerman if he could make any predictions and told him the public should be informed and aware of any potential dangers associated with the pollution in the town. Mr Westerman told him that the most important thing is to inform and educate the people of Waterboro--communication must be an open line to the public. Mr Westerman will look over the information available, determine if now is a good time for a study and get back to the Board with a cost figure to conduct one.
