

COUNCIL MEETING  
AUGUST 22, 1995

PRESENT: Ron Hackett, Dale Witman, Pam Witman, Cindy Allen, Frank Allen, Roland Denby, Larry Jacobsen, John Murray, Dianne Holden, Millard Genthner, Fred Fay, Don Holden, Bob Gobeil, David Benton, Richard Collette.

TOWN CLERK/TAX COLLECTOR/TREASURER: Dianne Holden reported that on August 30th the 1995 liens will be recorded, 250 are Lake Arrowhead Realty Trust. Updating the voters list and address changes from the Post Offices. Getting ready for the start of the Audit.

SAD DIRECTORS: Millard reported that all the positions have been filled and school starts Sept. 5th. The paving of the access road is completed at a cost of around \$59,600+-. Sel. Fay asked what will happen to the rest of the money that was raised for paving and Millard reported it will go back in the general fund. Sel. Fay also asked what is the percentage of increase in students this year and Millard told him that he hasn't received the figures yet. Approximately 280 teachers in the district with 40 ed. tech. Sel. Fay asked why the same ed. tech. are rehired each year, should be open each year. Discussed the union.

PARKS & REC.: Chm. Bob Gobeil reported that last week was the final week of the summer rec. program and everything went well. Had 62 children in the program this year. Still looking into a gas pump to water fields.

ROAD REVIEW COMMITTEE: Sel. Abbott told the committee that there needs to be a program for striping of the roads.

PLANNING BOARD: Cindy Allen reported that she is the new chair. Sel. Fay told her that it will be a pleasure to see the chairman at town meetings and public hearings.

TOWN PLANNER/SELECTMEN'S ASSISTANT: Dwayne Morin reported that he has been working with the Selectmen and the Planning Board. The new security system is in place and the computer system will be upgraded on Friday.

ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS: Dale Witman reported had a hearing three weeks ago for a cellular tower, this was for an administrative appeals. Coming back before the Board next week for a variance request. There is one vacancy on the Board.

CONSTABLE/ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER: Sel. Abbott reported that due to concern over the amount of rabies in York County, the Board met with Dr. Brewster and will be setting up a committee to set guidelines. Chauncey had been given the rabies vaccination shots.

RWS: Frank Allen reported looks like the tipping fee will increase to \$85.00 a ton and looks like a supplemental may be issued in December on the new rate. Commercial trash is down by 40%. The flow control is on hold in the congress. Suspect commercial haulers will be allowed to dump free.

TAYLOR HOUSE: Dianne Holden reported the music room and the curtains are done. Painting is being done. The Taylor family is bringing items back to the house. Partitioning displays with lights. Camp Laughing Loon will be donating items pertaining to the camp. A brochure is in the process of being printed. The fall fair will be Saturday, Sept. 9.

OSSIPEE LAKE ASSOC: Don Holden reported that he Ossipee Lake Assoc. is a non-union association. Held their annual meeting on Aug. 12 with about 50 people in attendance. The meeting was very well received, and thanked Sel. John Monteith for representing the Selectmen at that meeting. Game Warden Mark Warren attended the meeting. Discuss harbor master, and voted to stay with the coverage from Fish and Game. Same officers were voted in. There are about 200 paid members and you do not have to live on the lake to be a member. Sel. Fay asked about boat traffic. Don reported that it is heavy on weekends not during the week and not as radical as in the past. Discussed jet skis. Some states require an age requirement and classes. Don feels that 80% of the boats on the lake are from residents and 20% are hauled in.

LIBRARY: John Murray reported held their annual book and bake sale and had a profit of \$632.00 in just four hours. Will be meeting on Thursday at 7:30 to decide where the money should go.

WATER TRUSTEES: David Benton reported that they lost a few and gained a few. One was moving and two felt it was cheaper to go back onto their wells.

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**GENERAL DISCUSSION:**

Dale Witman asked what road projects are in the works. Fred Fay reported that the Deering Ridge Road is waiting for CMP to move a pole and then will be paved. Will be starting the Ossipee Hill Road project tomorrow which will be paved. And will work on the Hamilton Road which will be paved. Fred has concerns over the shoulders on the Hamilton Road and the Roberts Ridge Road. The pavement goes right to the edge with no room for shoulders. Possible on the Hamilton Road either line the sides or may have to cut the pavement. John Murray asked if the Town was going to do something for Kevin Bubier, suggested the Selectmen call or send a card. Richard Collette asked about the Buff Brook Road. Fred reported that the part that is in the Town of Waterboro has been graded. Shapleigh will not grade the road until it receives easements for all of the land owners due to being sued for damage done to a fence when they plowed the road. Sel. Abbott would like a meeting with Shapleigh to discuss easements with the landowners.
