

COUNCIL MEETING

JUNE 18, 2002

Opened public hearing for Eagles Club liquor license renewal at 7 p.m. No public comment. Motion by Willis and seconded by Bob to approve. Voted. Passed.

Linda Hanscom presented a 1903 Voter List to the town and it will be hung in the new town hall.

Selectmen's Report: Willis gave an update on the Hollis Town Meeting and Hollis past the new Transfer Station Contract. Bob explained it was a 3 year term with costs to Hollis of \$33,000 each year. Doug discussed new drainage, building, manhole cover, paving, signs, striping and traffic flow. Willis stated that if someone does not want to purchase a new sticker they can take their trash elsewhere or hire someone to haul it.

Code Enforcement Report: Report attached. Reported that Steve Wentworth will be leaving and moving on to Caribou.

Assessor: Currently reviewing permits since last April 1st. Will just be picking up new valuations. Should have projected figures by the end of July. Looks like an increase of \$8 million, same as last year.

Constable/Animal Control: Kevin explained what is happening with dogs. Explained the warrant process. Went out on 43 calls, issued 4 warnings, 2 summons, no court and 13 dogs at large. When he sees a dog in a yard or on a leash he does go ask if they are licensed. Has found 29 not licensed and 18 did not have a current rabies vaccination.

Old Home Days: Reported that it is going well and will begin on Friday, July 5th at 5 p.m. Read the event list.

SAD 57 Site Selection Committee: Doug reported on the site selection committee for the new Middle School. Discussed determining factors on sites. Need 3 phase which eliminates Newfield, parts of Limerick & Lyman & Shapleigh, NE of Deering Ridge and Webber Road. CMP has nothing to show where they have 3 phase. Next meeting will be discussing traffic and will be held on July 8th.

Road Commissioner: Dave reported that they have started to shim and the paving is finished on Jellerson Road. The end of Roberts Ridge will be done soon. Working on southerly end of Ossipee Hill Road. All projects will be completed by June 30th. July 1st will be starting South Middle Road and Thyngs Mills Road.

Water District: Line extension on Hamilton Road for the new business is complete and ready to go on line. New restaurant is on line. Doug explained the water system problems in Lake Arrowhead

- 1) Undersize lines
- 2) No storage

They are in the process of trying to get bond amount raised to improve the system. Bob reported that the Lake Arrowhead Committee, chaired by Shawn Shoemaker, is working very well.

Road Review Committee: Fred reported that they only had 3 people show up at the last meeting.

Transfer Station Committee: Reported that they will be back in August. Steadily making changes at the Transfer Station.

EMA: Pam reported that all is quiet, will be going to Caribou and the annual meeting is tomorrow night.

Library: Pam reported they will be holding a no clothes yard sale the last Saturday in June, annual Book & Bake Sale 9-2 the last Saturday of July. Would like to meet with the Selectmen on a new Library. Will be starting a building committee.

Fire Dept./EMS: Report attached.

Saco River Community Television: Tom Cyr reported that all towns fund the SRTV and they received an award from the State Police.

Taylor House Committee: Deb Wentworth reported that they started cleaning last week. Do not know if it will be open on weekends, not enough volunteers. Working on improvements and looking at barn display.

Charter Commission: Meeting tomorrow, will not meet in August then will double up.

Historical Society: Will be showing the movie "Village Storekeeper" on July 11th.

Finance Committee: Larry Jacobsen reported that they met last Wednesday to review the outcome of Town Meeting.

Public Safety Committee: Don Drew reported that the new Chairman is Gary Fecteau and Pat McHugh is the Vice-Chair. They meet once a month.

Cemetery Committee: Edie Hutchinson reported that they spent the morning at the Nature Conservancy on a Veteran's Cemetery which is in really rough shape. Four new cemeteries have been adopted by the cub scouts. Have lost a small cemetery in the logging operation. Would like to know when a logging operation is going on in town. Bob suggests marking cemeteries, this had just field stones, did not look like a cemetery. For a cemetery on your own property it needs to be ¼ acre and fenced in.

General Discussion: Scott Young reported that he understands a purchase order will hold the money for fire rods and the work should be done by November. John Littlefield told him fire roads which are town roads. Scott would like to use on trails since it is snowmobile registrations.
