RWS Representative: Reported on the deficit at RWS. Currently they are \$2 million and this may increase to \$4 million next year. The main problem is with the larger cities where the haulers are taking their trash to other facilities for less. They are currently looking into the possibility of enforcing flow control and also the remote possibility of closing RWS.

Road Commissioner: Reported that they are currently on Chadbourne Ridge Road and are waiting for the pavement on this and Middle Road Will be moving to Thyngs Mills Road next. Will be starting on the winter sand soon. Received the new forks for the loader.

Water District: Reported they have another new applicant. Will be meeting with the general contractor tomorrow about a possible extension of the water line from Gorham Savings to almost down to the former video store on Rte. 5. Reported that they are looking at enlarging the well and that their security system works very well.

Road Review Committee: Reported that they are working on the budget and their 5 & 10 year plan. Also had some roads striped.

Saco River Community Television Corp.: Tom Cyr reported that he will be finishing the wiring tomorrow and should be able to broadcast meetings live within another week. Also reported that the town can now request playbacks just within their town so can get more air time.
