

## SELECTMEN'S MEETING MINUTES

October 31, 2006

**ATTENDING:** Evan Grover, Robert Fay, Dwayne Woodsome, Cindy Moore, Jon Gale, Nancy Brandt, Pam Witman, Tom Cyr, Brigit McCallum and Jack Seery

Selectman Grover called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm with the pledge to the flag

### NEW BUSINESS

1. Selectman Gale explained that as of January 1<sup>st</sup> we need to switch to Dept. of Public Safety for our PSAP and dispatch. This requires some new equipment which will be handled by Southern Maine Regional Planning. At this point we need to commit \$2,500 right away so they can begin work. There is a good chance that this money will be reimbursed by a grant we have applied for. Motion by Selectman Fay and seconded by Selectman Gale to obligate \$2,500 from the dispatch account. Vote 5-0-0

### OLD BUSINESS

1. Selectman Grover explained that they will not be holding Recycling Day activities on November 11<sup>th</sup> as that is Veteran's Day and would be very disrespectful. Suggested that they do this more towards spring. Motion by Selectman Fay and seconded by Selectman Moore to hold a Recycling Day in the spring, May or April and let the Transfer Station Committee choose the date. Vote 5-0-0. Discussed closing the Transfer Station on Veteran's Day. Agreed to stay open but wanted to make it clear that they mean no disrespect to the Veteran's with this decision.

### OTHER

1. Motion by Selectman Fay and seconded by Selectman Moore to sign the warrants for bills and payroll. Vote 5-0-0
2. Motion by Selectman Fay and seconded by Selectman Moore to accept the minutes of 10/24/06 as written. Vote 5-0-0
3. Selectman Woodsome read the reminders and noted that there will be a Public Hearing for Sullie's Liquor License Renewal held by the state here on Monday, November 6, 2006 at 9:30 am
4. Selectman Fay reported that they are running the water line to Goodall Medical Building so there is some traffic tie-up from the intersection at Hannaford up to the site.
5. Selectman Grover announced that the Transfer Station is now closed on Mondays. Stated that they will continue to announce this for the next few weeks until the word gets around.
6. Selectman Fay stated that they need to develop something to give the Deputy some teeth when it comes to people dumping trash.
7. Selectman Woodsome asked that hunters parking on Bennett Hill Road please park off the pavement or in the designated areas. Reported that he had been at the Public Works earlier and there were cars parked where the trucks delivering salt could not get in or out of the gate and the Road Commissioner currently has salt being delivered regularly

to build up the stockpile.

8. Selectman Fay wished Bill Hanson well as he is in a Portland Hospital after suffering a stroke.
