The minutes from the March 26, 2007 meeting were approved 4 to 0.

April 21st is voting day and David, Don and Ray Davis to share manning a recycling booth.

The committee will be recommending to the Selectmen that the Transfer Station close the day of Town Meeting so Transfer Station employees may attend.

It has been suggested to the committee that the Transfer Station should have longer hours. The committee has gone over the hours and will be making a recommendation to the Selectmen at a later date.

Earth Day - Hannaford expressed an interest in doing 4 hours of clean up. David mentioned clean up at Friendship Park and Ossipee Pines. Clint suggested instead of having Hannaford doing clean up have Hannaford set up a booth in front of their store for 4 hours promoting recycling. David will get back to Hannaford with the suggestion.

The Solid Hazardous Special Waste Ordinance and the Transfer Station/Recycling Facility Operations Manual was discussed in detail.

The committee discussed that Dean Waterhouse's contract expires in June. The committee will be recommending to the Selectmen that the Town retains Dean at a 10% increase for 2 years. A motion was made by David and 2nd by Don and approved 4 to 0.

David suggested to the committee that we need to work out a system over the next few months to continue compacting the town's trash at zero cost to the town.

Brigit met with Superintendent Linda Green last week. Brigit was given permission to speak to all the school principals about Brigit starting up a recycling program. Clint informed the committee that in May there will be 6 silver bullets coming for the schools.

David will be working on running an ad in the paper to promote the budget of \$3,000.00 for the committee.

Town Website - Don did some research and found that our website links to a page that is very old and outdated.

Old Home Days - The committee's theme will be recycling and it was suggested that we should have a recycling king, queen, prince and princess in order to involve the kids. Brigit will also be working with the Old Home Days Committee.

Don noted that coming from various routes there are 35 signs in Waterboro that could advertise

recycling. Don will be approaching the sign owners to put up something promoting recycling.

The next Transfer Station meeting will be April 30, 2007 at 7:00 PM
